Pool related both he and his brother were in the cafeteria when the incident started. Ryan was closer to the south entrance and Steven was closer to the elevator. Steven took the elevator to the library floor. He looked out and saw a bunch of smoke.

This Investigator asked Steven to identify those people in the elevator with him. He identified those he could remember as:

LEARY, MIKE  
GONZALES, DANNY  
LEBSACK, STEPHANIE

and

JENNY (JAN) - NFI

Steven was standing near the front of the elevator. When the elevator reached the second floor, he saw a bunch of smoke and a burnt hole in the floor. He also heard a bunch of gunshots.

They decided to go back down. When they got back to the cafeteria, it was full of smoke. Someone was standing at the door to the auditorium. At the backstage entrance, it was Coach Andres. The coach was in the auditorium with the kids. There was one other teacher in there, however, Steven does not remember his name.

At one point, someone was trying to get into the upper door. Coach Andres ran up with a 2 x 4 in his hand. When the coach was gone, a custodian came in and told everybody to get out of there. They went out the foreign language door.

Once outside, they ran across Pierce to the park. They were in the park, then everyone started running. Someone yelled, "There he is." Everyone was running from the park.

When they returned to the cafeteria, there was a lot of smoke. This Investigator asked if any of his friends had seen the gunmen? Someone told Pool that "Screech" had seen the gunmen and they told him to get out of there. This Investigator asked Pool if he knew the real name for Screech and he indicated he would look in the yearbook.

This Investigator asked Pool if in all the stories and rumors, has anyone said they have seen more than two people involved and he said no.

After looking at the yearbook, Pool identified Screech as John Savage. Savage apparently saw the gunmen and they let him go. Savage came running downstairs, where he was seen by Pool. Savage was by himself.

Savage went out the building the same time Pool did. Savage was ahead of Pool's group. At one point, Savage looked back at them. They went down the hall and out the exit in the foreign language area.

This Investigator asked Pool if he knew Eric Harris or Dylan Klebold? He related he knew Harris by sight. Last year they had gym class together.

This Investigator inquired if Pool knew [REDACTED] Pool stated he has seen a real tall kid. He was with the group sometimes. On the day of the incident, Pool did not see him at school.

The first time Pool saw Savage, Savage was on the middle platform of the stairs. He was running and did not have anything in his hands. This Investigator asked Pool who told him about Savage being released? He indicated he does not remember.

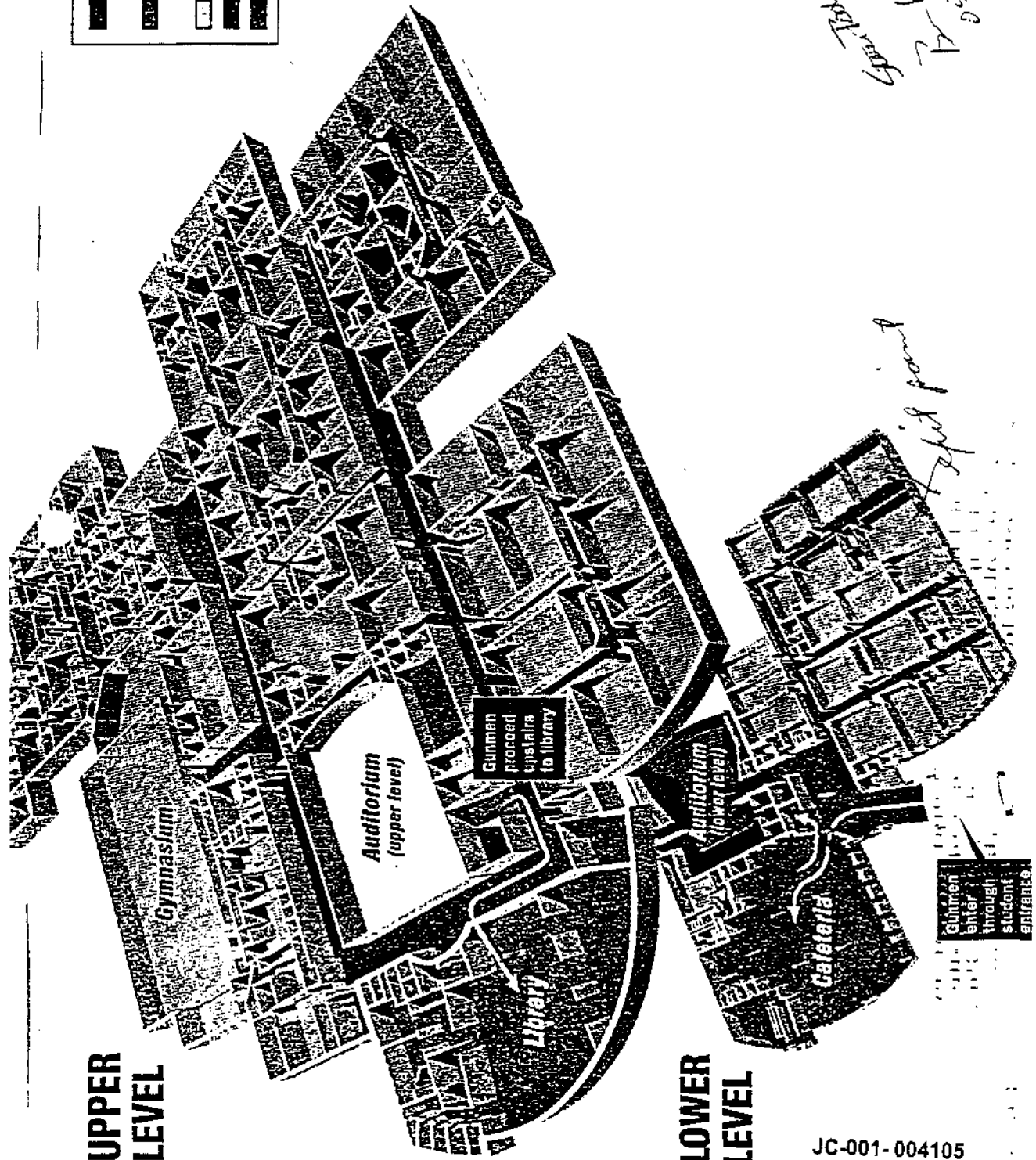
On 05-17-99 at about 2145 hrs., this Investigator telephoned Pool to verify information reference our initial interview. This Investigator asked Pool if he could describe the clothing being worn by Savage when he saw Savage running from the building. Pool believed Savage was wearing jeans and a stripped shirt, mostly white in color.

Pool also wanted to correct the fact that Stephanie Lebsack was not on the elevator with him.

On April 28, 1999 at 1300 hours I met with Melissa Porter and her father, Gene Porter, at 6190 South Fenton Court in Littleton, Colorado for the purpose of an interview

Melissa Porter provided the following information about the Columbine High School incident, which occurred on April 20, 1999:

- Melissa stated that she got out of Science class at the first bell, 11:10 a.m. She stated that she immediately went down to the cafeteria via the inside stairs and was by herself. She stated that she did not see or hear anything unusual at that time. She stated that she was sitting at table "UU" (as designated by the FBI Evidence Diagram) and was facing to the east (away from the windows). She also included the route in which she took to get to the table (see attached diagram). She stated that it took about three or four minutes to get to table "UU" after leaving class. She stated that she did not hear the second bell (11:15), but that she "usually doesn't because it is too loud"
- Melissa stated that she put her soft-sided brief case down, got lunch and then returned to the table and sat with Courtney Stinton (937-9576). Courtney Stinton was facing the west windows. She stated that it took about four or five minutes to get her lunch and then sit down again. Melissa was wearing blue jeans and a striped tank top. She stated that her soft-sided briefcase is dark blue and contained her Spanish book, vocabulary book and her calculator.
- Melissa stated that Carrie O'Merra and Monica Donovan usually sit there but that they were not there that day. She stated that sometimes Carrie and Monica go out to eat or go home for lunch. She stated that she is not friends with Carrie or Monica.
- Melissa stated that she had been eating lunch for about two or three minutes before she was alerted that something was going on. She stated that she heard "two shots" that sounded "like they were apart" rather than "right after each other". She stated that everyone started to crowd around the "west lunch windows" and that she thought it was probably a fight.
- Melissa stated that she turned around and look for "about five or six seconds" and saw "two people" outside the window. She stated that they were near the edge of the grass and the sidewalk. She stated that they were "probably male and both dressed in black". She stated that she saw they "both had guns that were pointing up". She could not provide any details on the dress or the physical description of the gunmen. She could not provide any information on the guns or whether they were right handed or left handed. She could not provide any information as to their movement either.
- Melissa stated that she also saw "two people on the ground". She could not identify them or provide details about them either. She did locate the gunmen and the bodies on the attached diagram.
- Melissa stated that she "thought it was a joke or that they were playing" so she "turned around and started to eat again"
- Melissa stated that she then heard one of the janitors yell "get under the table" and that this janitor probably came from the teachers lounge just a few feet from her table. Melissa stated that she and Courtney got under the table and that she remembers seeing Adam Sands while under the table too. She stated that they were not under the table for "about one minute" and then they started to "scoot on the floor towards the stairs". She stated that they did not get very far when a female teacher, also on the floor and under a table said "get the hell out of here". She stated that they got up and ran towards the stairs.
- Melissa stated that she did not see anything under the table other than "table legs and backpacks". She stated that the backpacks "seemed normal" and not unusually "large"

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- Melissa stated that she didn't move at first and thought that she was one of the last to get up the stairs. She stated that while on the landing of the stairs she "heard about ten (10) shots" and that they seemed "to be closer" and probably "coming from the inside". She stated that the shots seemed to "come from behind them" rather than "in front of them". She stated that she then went down the Science hall and out the Math doors. She stated that she heard the "same gun sounds in the hall and two (2) explosions". She stated that she could not tell where the "sounds were coming from". She did not see any gunmen in the halls while she was exiting the building. She stated that she then ran across the street to Leawood Park and heard "one loud boom". Melissa remembers seeing a Jarret Baer while she was running down and out the hall.
- Melissa stated that she is "aware of the Trench Coat Mafia (TCM)" and that "they are just a click". She stated that they seemed "really nice to her". She stated that she did not know Dylan Klebold, but that she has spoken to Eric Harris on several occasions. She stated that she last saw and spoke to Eric Harris about two (2) months ago.
- Melissa stated that Eric would "want to meet in the Library during third hour". She stated that third hour is her free hour and they would go to the Library. She stated that "Eric never talked about his friends or what he did", but that they would only talk about "how they hated homework" and "stuff like that". She stated that she "though Eric got expelled" and that is why she hasn't seen him for about two months.
- Melissa stated that she also knows of a Stephanie Kinney (sic) who used to be in the TCM last year. She describes Stephanie as short, heavy set and with died red or brown hair.
- Melissa's mother stated that she knows of a Monette Park (female) who is reportedly a Social Worker for the school district was in the cafeteria for the "whole thing until the fire started".
- Melissa stated that "Michael Robson ran past the gunmen in the Library".
- Melissa stated that she did not hear anything about "guns or bombs" at school prior to this incident. She stated that she only heard the typical "I hate the jocks stuff".

I gave Melissa Porter and her father my business card should they need to have a contact regarding this incident. Included with this report is the diagram that Melissa Porter drew her location, entrance into and exit out of the cafeteria.

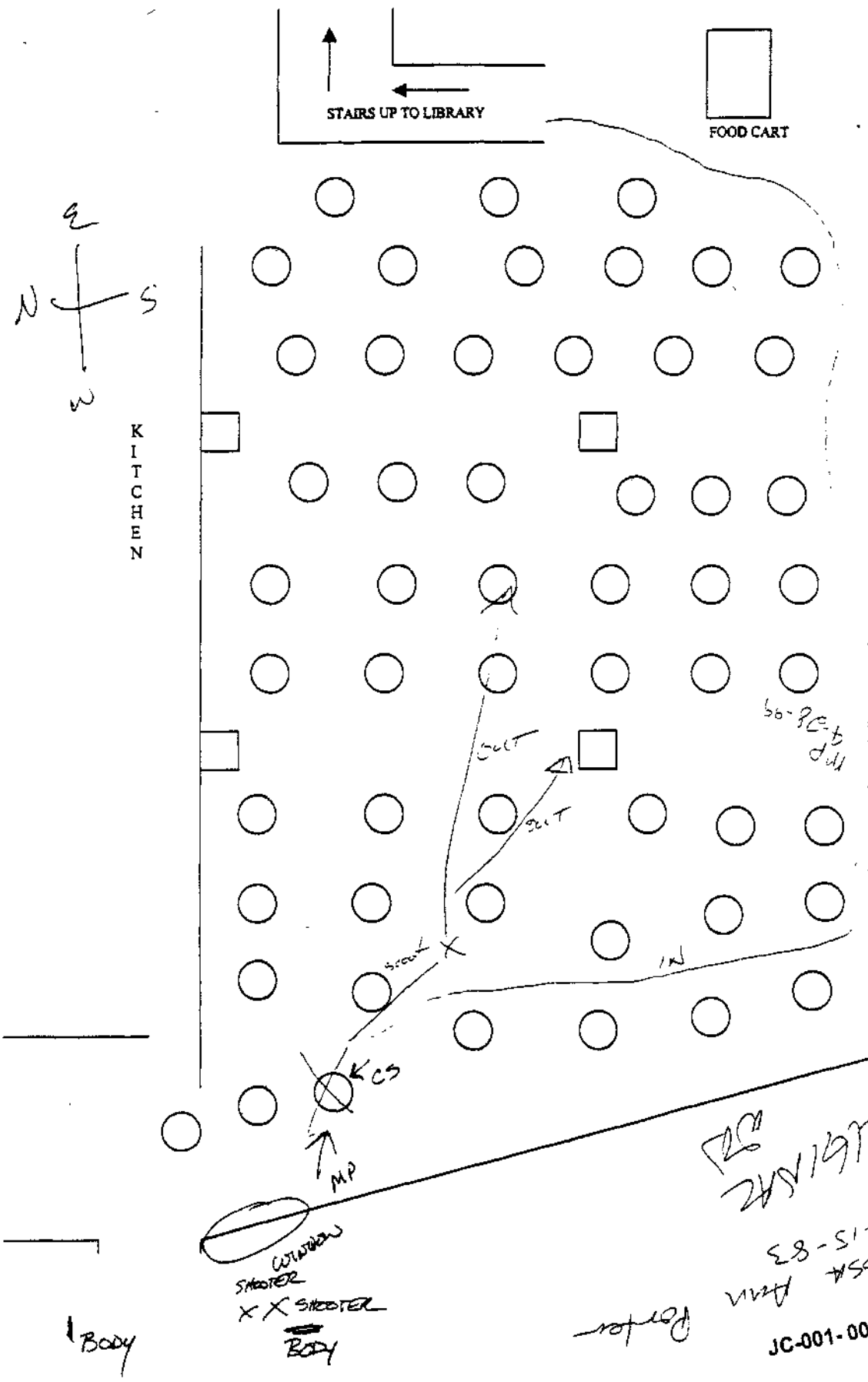

Narrative: Re: Control #1702

On 04-28-1999, Ellen Prommersberger, a sophomore at CHS, was interviewed at her residence. She acknowledged having "A" lunch and was seated at table "NN" with 1. Shawn Lee; 2. Diana Cohen; 3. Steve Cohen; and possibly 2-3 other friends.

Prior to lunch, she had been in the Publications room, had gone to her locker and had arrived in the lunchroom at approximately 1110.

While seated in the lunchroom, she first became aware of problems when a number of kids ran to the windows on the south side of the lunchroom and began screaming. Shortly thereafter, she heard shots, and she ran up the main stairs to the 1<sup>st</sup> level, and entered a science classroom. She remained barricaded in a greenhouse with other students to include 1. Peter Henderson; 2. Katie Patrick; 3. Susanne Meyer; 4. Leigh Kamens (303-972-3057) and a teacher, Mrs. Williams.


While in the greenhouse, she observed 1 shot fired into the room from the outside. The round entered through a window. While in the room, Leigh Kamens identified [redacted] as one of the gunmen. She was able to hear the gunmen in the hall outside her hiding place and heard them to say "I want to die today", and "Let's find more people". She described the gunmen as laughing. She could not recognize the voices or determine how many different voices she heard. She and the other students were eventually evacuated by SWAT officers.

She had been wearing a yellow shirt, blue jeans and a blue/pink flannel shirt the day of the incident. Her long hair had been worn in a pony tail.

She uses the internet, and her e mail address id "El Babe01".

She identified Jesse Rush as the girlfriend of Pat McDuffy.

Jocelyn Provo said on 04-20-99, at about 1115 hours, she arrived in the Columbine High School cafeteria for lunch. She said she was carrying her backpack (described as a purple "Eddie Bauer") upon entering the cafeteria. Jocelyn Provo showed me on a map of the cafeteria where she had been sitting. She showed me that she was sitting at either table "H" or "G," however, she believed she was at table "H." Jocelyn Provo said she was sitting where she was facing in a westerly direction and said the following friends were seated at the table with her, Betsy Kwereneland, Jennie Ribble, Chris Mesias, Lauren Tocci, and said she believed Mike Gagne and Jessica Geurtz were there also, however, she could not be sure. Jocelyn Provo said she put her backpack on the floor next to the chair she was going to sit in.

Jocelyn Provo said she and Betsy Kwereneland were working on Betsy's homework and Jocelyn Provo was helping her with it when the janitors ran through the cafeteria yelling to the students to get down on the floor and under the tables. Jocelyn Provo said she did so, but shortly after she believed she saw other students who were getting up to sit in their chairs. She said the janitor yelled again at them and told them to get back on the floor and under the tables. She also told us that she originally believed the incident was a senior prank. She said a short time later, she got up and began to run from the cafeteria toward the stairway leading to the second floor of Columbine High School. She said Chris Mesias, Lauren Tocci, Jennie Ribble, and she were running together. She said they were all helping each other run up the stairs and said when she got to the top of the stairs she heard two to three "pops." She believed these were gunshots coming from behind her, possibly in the cafeteria. Jocelyn Provo said when she reached the top of the stairs, they turned to their left. She did not hear any noises or sounds coming from the area of the library. Jocelyn Provo said after turning left, she was running down the halls with her hands on Jennie Ribble's back, then took a hold of her shoulders to help her get down the hallway and exit the school. She said it was at this time while they were running, that she believed she heard three to four more shots, described as not being as loud as the first two. Jocelyn Provo said after they exited the school, they went across into Leawood Park where other friends were at. Jocelyn Provo said she then ran to Leawood Elementary School and called her parents. Jocelyn Provo said prior to her leaving Leawood Park, she did not see or hear anything unusual. She did say when she was at Leawood Park, she fell into a chain link fence, causing minor injuries to her legs. She did not, however, hear any shots while she was in Leawood Park.

Jocelyn Provo said prior to this incident she did not know who suspect Klebold or suspect Harris was, and said she doesn't know anything about the Trench Coat Mafia. She said since the incident, she has seen a picture of suspect Klebold through the media

and then remembered seeing him walking in a hallway at Columbine High School. She said she could not provide any further information about the suspects or the Trench Coat Mafia.

I showed Jocelyn Provo the photographs of the blue duffle bag and a propane tank found in the cafeteria after the incident on 04-20-99. Jocelyn Provo said she did not see either item in the cafeteria prior to or during the incident. She said she has not heard nor does she know of anyone who may be making explosive devices and/or possessing firearms.

**ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:** Dan Provo said his family is moving to Edmond, Oklahoma at the beginning of June 1999. Their new home address will be 1613 N. I gave a business card to Jocelyn Provo and Dan Provo and said if they needed a J.C.S.O. victim advocate to assist them, to call me and I would make the necessary arrangements for them.

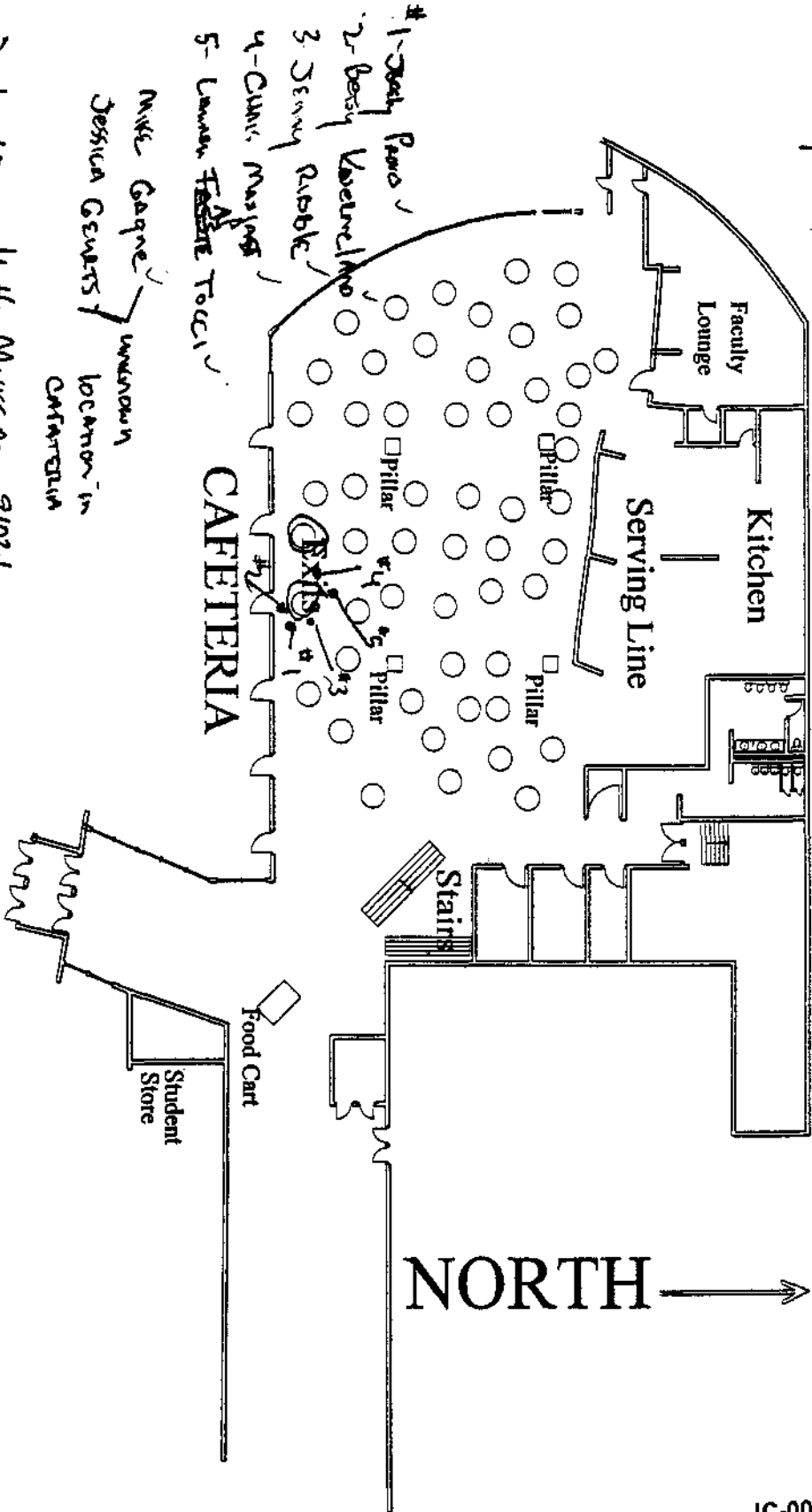

WE LOOKED OUT + SAW ONE KID ON THE GROUND. ANOTHER KID CAME IN + SAID 'MAYONE HAS A GUN. WE ALL GOT DOWN. THEN A COUPLE OF MINUTES LATER EVERYBODY STARTED RUNNING. I WENT INTO THE AUDITORIUM + THERE WERE ABOUT 70 KIDS + A COUPLE OF TEACHERS IN THERE. THEY LOCKED ALL THE DOORS + WE STAYED THERE ABOUT 10 MINUTES. ONE OF THE JANITORS SAID WE SHOULD GO OUT THROUGH THE FOREIGN LANGUAGE HALL. WE WENT THAT WAY, OUT THE DOOR + ACROSS THE STREET TO LEANING PARK THERE WERE MORE SHOTS + WE WENT BACK INTO THE NEIGHBORHOOD.

I have read the foregoing statement and the facts contained therein are true to the best of my knowledge and belief. I do not maintain that it contains all of the facts or details of the incident, but only those facts about which I have been asked.

**INVESTIGATION:**

On 05-12-99 at 0930 hours I interviewed Ravi Rau in the presence of his 25 year-old sister, Athi, at his home. I had talked to Ravi's father prior to this interview to obtain his permission.

Ravi stated his father dropped him off at school on 04-20-99 at approximately 0715 hours. He entered through the main entrance and noticed nothing unusual outside.

Ravi stated he did not know who KLEBOLD or HARRIS were. He stated he had heard about the "trench coat mafia" group but stated they were more prevalent last year than this year. He stated he saw a few kids occasionally wearing long, black coats.

Ravi has choir first hour, statistics second hour, math third hour, and fourth hour is his off hour which he spent in the library. Ravi stated he entered the library ten minutes after the third hour class was over. He stated he noticed nothing unusual around the school. He sat at the table closest to the trophy or glass display case.

Ravi stated that he left the library five to ten minutes before the end of fourth hour bell rang. He stated he went to his locker and then went down stairs and entered the cafeteria. It was approximately 1110 to 1115 hours when he got to the cafeteria and he said a lot of kids were already there.

Ravi indicated on the attached diagram the route that he took through the cafeteria and he sat at either table "N" or table "AA". He brought his lunch so he went directly to the table. He stated he did not notice any large

Ravi looked out the west window and saw some underclassmen run north west and jump over the baseball field fence. He thought there were three that went over the fence and one other guy followed them but fell near the sidewalk. (See diagram) He stated he thought Mr. Sanders walked up to this student then came running back toward the school. He stated the fallen student then got up and started to run. At this time Ravi thought there was a fight outside.

Ravi stated he saw a person wearing dark attire walk out of the north to the sidewalk entrance of the fence that is outside of the cafeteria. He saw this person light an object that was about the size of a loaf of bread. This person threw the lighted object into the parking lot where it exploded. He stated all the kids in the cafeteria ran east.

Ravi stated that Ms. Lucus was in the cafeteria at this time. She yelled for everyone to get down. Ravi stated he went to the stairs and was on the first landing when he heard an explosion go off above him. He stated he then saw smoke coming from the upstairs. At that time the teacher yelled for everyone to go to the Spanish hall. He ran to the last room along with 20 to 30 other kids. He indicated where this room is on the attached diagram. He stated they were in this room for approximately 10 minutes. While in this room a teacher tried to call 911 but was unable to get through. He stated there was a period of silence and then two very loud and separate explosions went off. He stated that the teacher looked in the hallway to see if it was clear and then they all ran out the south door. He stated they ran through the parking lot and south on Pierce Street to the first house which is a Mormon or seminary house. He stated after that he left with a friend named Stephanie Plank.

Ravi stated he had his backpack with him and did not leave anything in the cafeteria. He was wearing a white T-shirt and Khaki shorts with sandals and socks. Ravi stated he did not hear anything about those students being on the computer or having web sites.

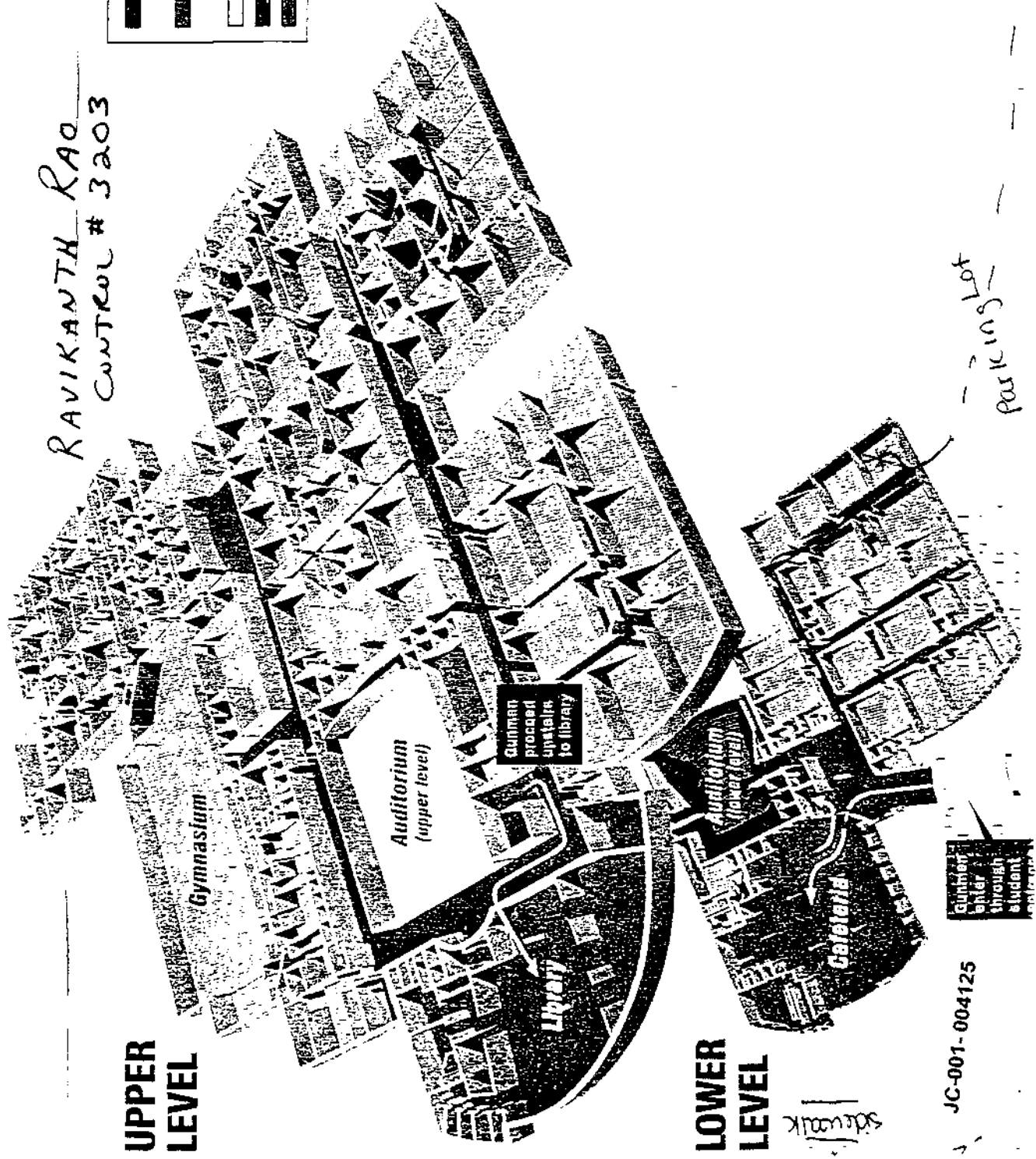

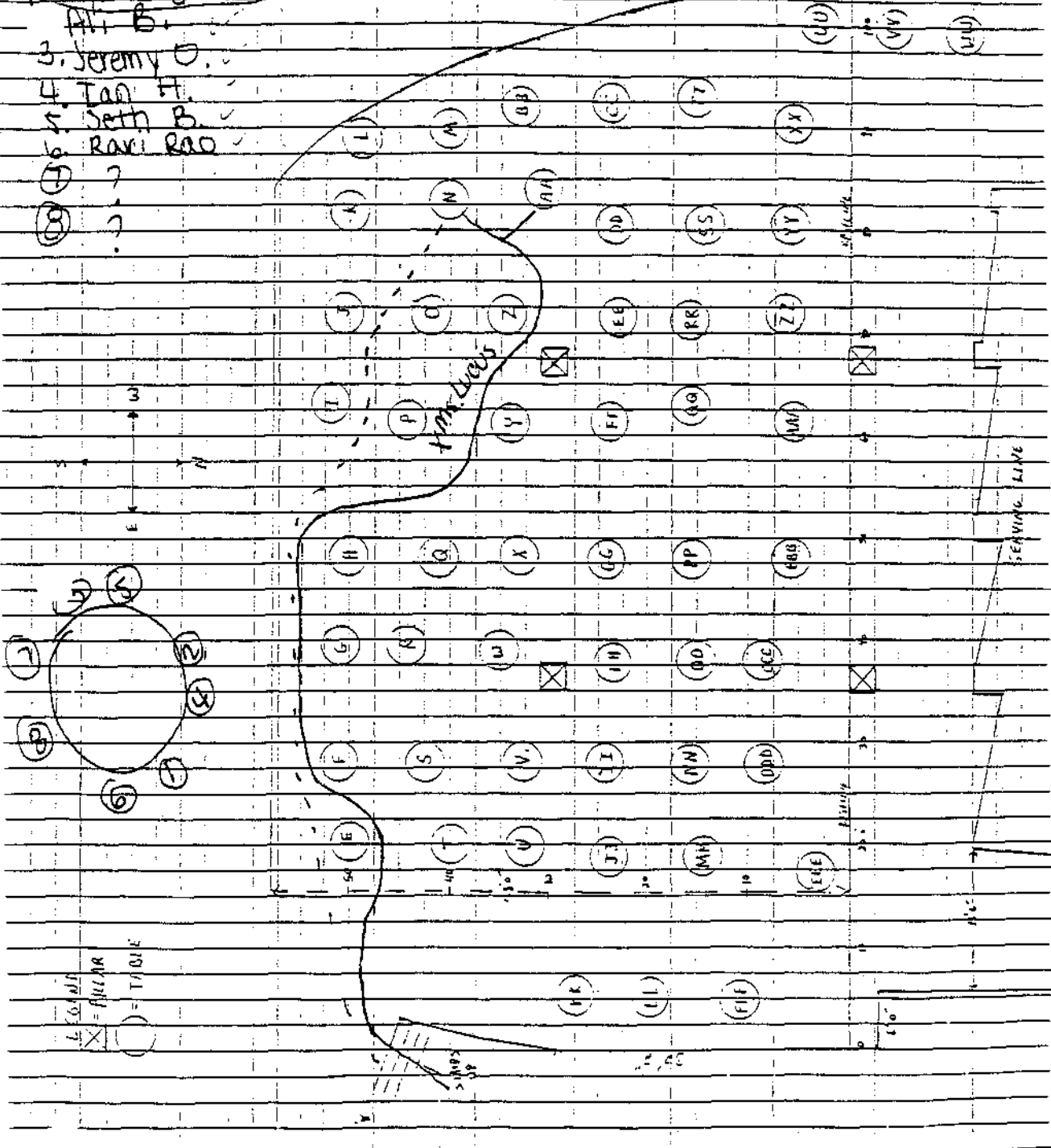

On 4/29/99 I interviewed 16 year old CHS student Brian Rathburn at his home in Littleton, Co. Brian's father was present for this interview.

Brian advised me he was in the CHS cafeteria on 4/20/99 for "A" lunch at 11:25am. He stated he had come from the choir room with Aaron Brown, a CHS student. They went into the cafeteria to the food line and sat down at their table with three other friends.

I provided Brian a drawing of the cafeteria, which depicted the tables and their location in the cafeteria. I pointed out specific areas, such as food line, kitchen and west windows of the cafeteria to give Brian a better understanding of the lay-out in this drawing. I asked Brian to circle the table he was sitting at with his friends. He circled table XX. He recalled the CHS students sitting with him were Dave Smith, Aaron Brown, Jacob Bauer and Jake Mayes. Brian recalled he was sitting facing the cafeteria, towards the south east. He believed that Jacob Bauer was facing the west windows and Dave Smith was seated on his right.

Brian stated he did not notice any unusually large duffle bags anywhere in the cafeteria, although pointed out that there are "hundreds of backpacks and bags in there during lunch". I asked specifically about large dark duffle bags laying alone. He responded that he did not see this. He also stated he did not notice anyone carrying a suspiciously large duffle bag in school that morning, or any other day.

Brain stated that at about 11:30am the students at the table behind him, next to the windows (UU) stood up to look out the west windows. He believed that CHS students Eric Larson, Logan Smith and Brendon Trujillo were at table UU. At this same time, Mr Sanders came running into the cafeteria and yelled "get down". Dan Ricks a CHS student yelled to drop the tables in case they come in. Brian stated he did not see any gunman, but did hear shots.

Students began to crawl under tables, and some tables fell over. Brian recalled laying there for a few seconds, then he and several students crawled towards the steps inside the cafeteria. He stated he crawled through the middle of the cafeteria and then stood up to run near the south doors. Brian did not recall seeing any unusual duffle bags as he exited the cafeteria.

He ran upstairs, hearing 2-3 more gunshots behind him in the cafeteria. He ran down the hall where he grabbed CHS student Denae Pedersen who was alone and frightened. They ran together and turned into the auditorium and ran through it into the main hallway. He heard 3-4 more shots behind him, then the fire alarms went off. They turned towards the administration exit (east) and ran towards the exit door. When they arrived at the administration exit, the windows in the exit doors had been shot out. They exited the building and ran towards Clemont park. Brain stated he did not encounter any gunman while running through the school.


In Clemont park he and Denae saw Aaron Brown who ran to his car. Brian and Denae were picked up by Aaron in his vehicle in Clemont park. They drove immediately to Colorow Elementary school where Brian's mother is a secretary. Brain believed they arrived there at 11:45am. They informed his mother, who had not yet heard what had happened. Brian assisted getting the elementary kids off the playground.


They then left Colorow school and drove to Aaron's home on Vance street. Brian recalled they were making phone calls when Aaron's brother Brook Brown arrived at the home. Brian believed Brook

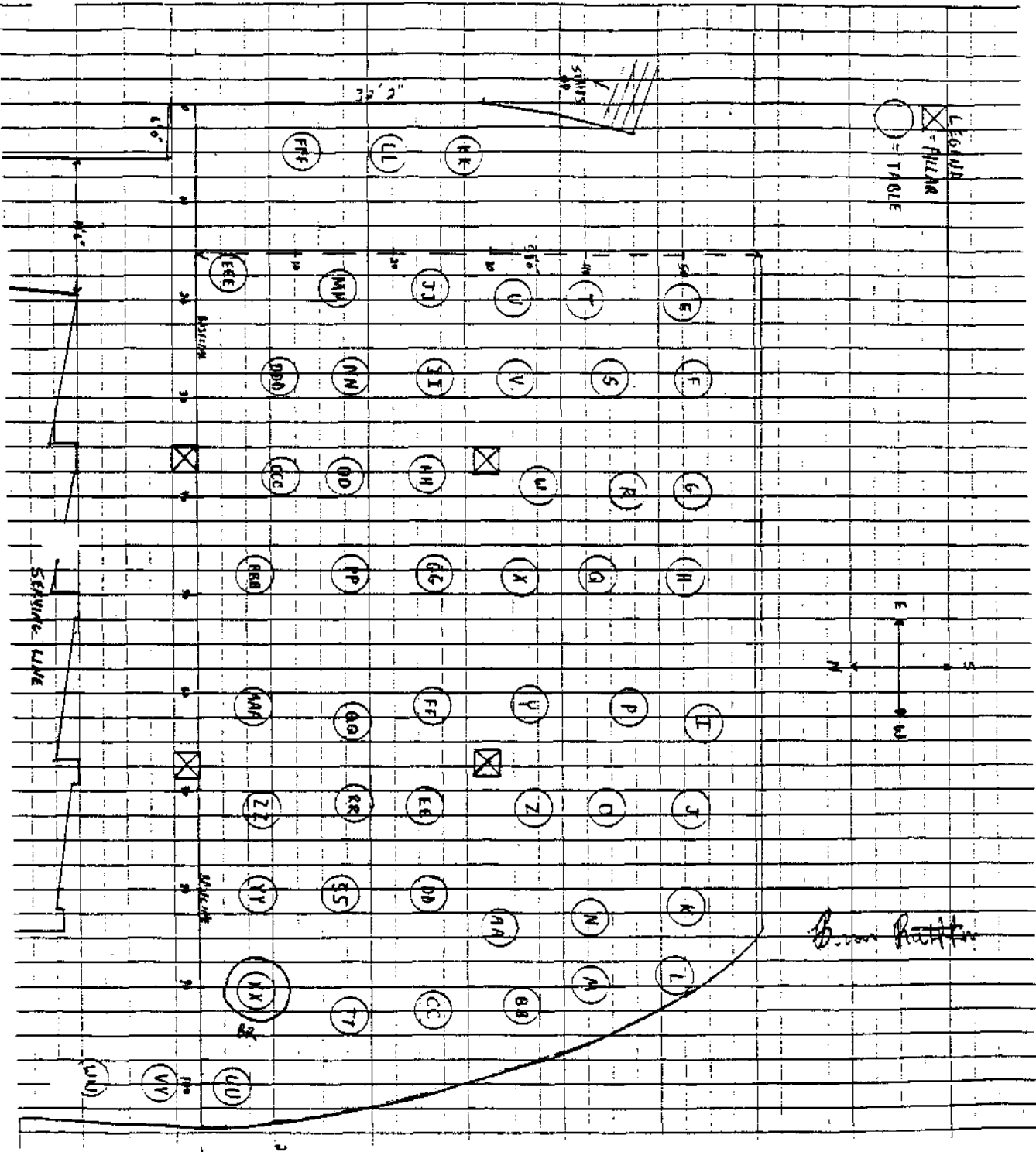
arrived about 15 minutes after they did, which was around 12:30pm. Brian stated that Brook hugged his brother Aaron and said, "I know who did this". He was very sure that Eric Harris had been involved in some way.

Brian was wearing a white T shirt and tan pants with a blue sports hat when he exited the cafeteria. He left a black eastpack backpack with 2 tuxedo choir shirts in it. Brian had no more information on this incident.

**INVESTIGATION:**

On 06-15-99, I was assigned Lead #4429 to interview Zachary Rauzi, who was a Columbine High School student on 04-20-99, who was assigned "A" lunch.

On 06-15-99, at about 1001 hours, I left a message on the answering machine at the listed home phone for Zachary Rauzi, 303-978-9961. At 1220 hours, I received a page to that number. At 1225, I recontacted the number and spoke with a male who identified himself as Zachary Rauzi.

I told Rauzi that I wanted to speak with him about the incident at Columbine High School on 04-20-99. He stated that 4th period he had Language Arts with Mr. Friesen and when class was over, went to his locker and then to the cafeteria. I asked Rauzi where he was sitting in the cafeteria. He stated he was sitting near the elevator, near the pop machines, where you get your food. I asked Rauzi who he was sitting with him and he stated that he didn't know. He stated that he sat down at about 1115 Rauzi stated that someone came into the cafeteria and said there was someone outside with a gun and told people to get under the tables. I asked him if this was a teacher or student and he stated he really didn't know. I asked him who was underneath the table with him and again Rauzi stated he didn't know. Rauzi stated he looked up and there were people running. He stated that he ran through the auditorium and went out a door near the weight rooms and counseling area.

I asked Rauzi if he had heard anything. He stated that while in the cafeteria, he heard a bomb go off under a car. I asked him

how it was he knew it was under a car, and he stated that they could see smoke coming out from underneath a gray Izuzi Rodeo belonging to Eric Conant. I asked him if he had heard anything else and he stated he didn't think so. I asked him if when he looked outside, he could see anyone or see any other activity and he stated he did not. I asked Rauzi if he saw anything else while running outside of the school. He noticed the front doors near the main office were broken out, when he ran threw that area. I asked Rauzi how long he believed he had been under the table prior to running and he stated probably only about 30 seconds Rauzi stated once outside he ran into Clement Park where his car was parked, and with seven or so other unidentified people left.

I told Rauzi that I would like to meet with him to show him some diagrams of the school and see if he could point out where exactly he had been in the cafeteria. Rauzi agreed to me meeting him at his residence on 06-16-99, at about 1030 hours.

**INVESTIGATION:**

On 06-16-99, at about 1040 hours, I met with Zachary Rauzi and his mother, Doreen Rauzi, at their home. I told Zachary Rauzi that I wanted to show him diagrams of Columbine High School. I showed him a diagram that is an enlargement of the cafeteria area. I asked him to show me where he had been sitting during lunch. Rauzi put an "X" in the area where he believed he had been sitting and put his initials on it. He stated that it was the second table in from the area of the serving line. I then asked Rauzi to draw on the map for me the way he had left the school. He did so by drawing a line out through the auditorium. I then handed him another diagram of Columbine High School which showed the upper level of the school. I asked Rauzi to start again from the auditorium and again draw his path out of the school. Rauzi drew up the side of the auditorium and out into the main hall. He drew a line down a hallway heading toward the gym, but then determined that was not the hall that he meant. I marked an "X" over that path. Rauzi then drew a line out toward the main office area of the school and down a hallway heading north. He stated that it went out near the gym doors and he then went to Clement Park. Rauzi again stated that he was not sure who he had been sitting with at the tables. He stated that he had not actually been sitting at a table he normally sits at. I asked Rauzi if he noticed anything unusual in the cafeteria and he stated he did not. I asked him if he noticed anything unusual in the way of backpacks or bags and he stated he did not. He stated he did actually grab his backpack and take it with him.

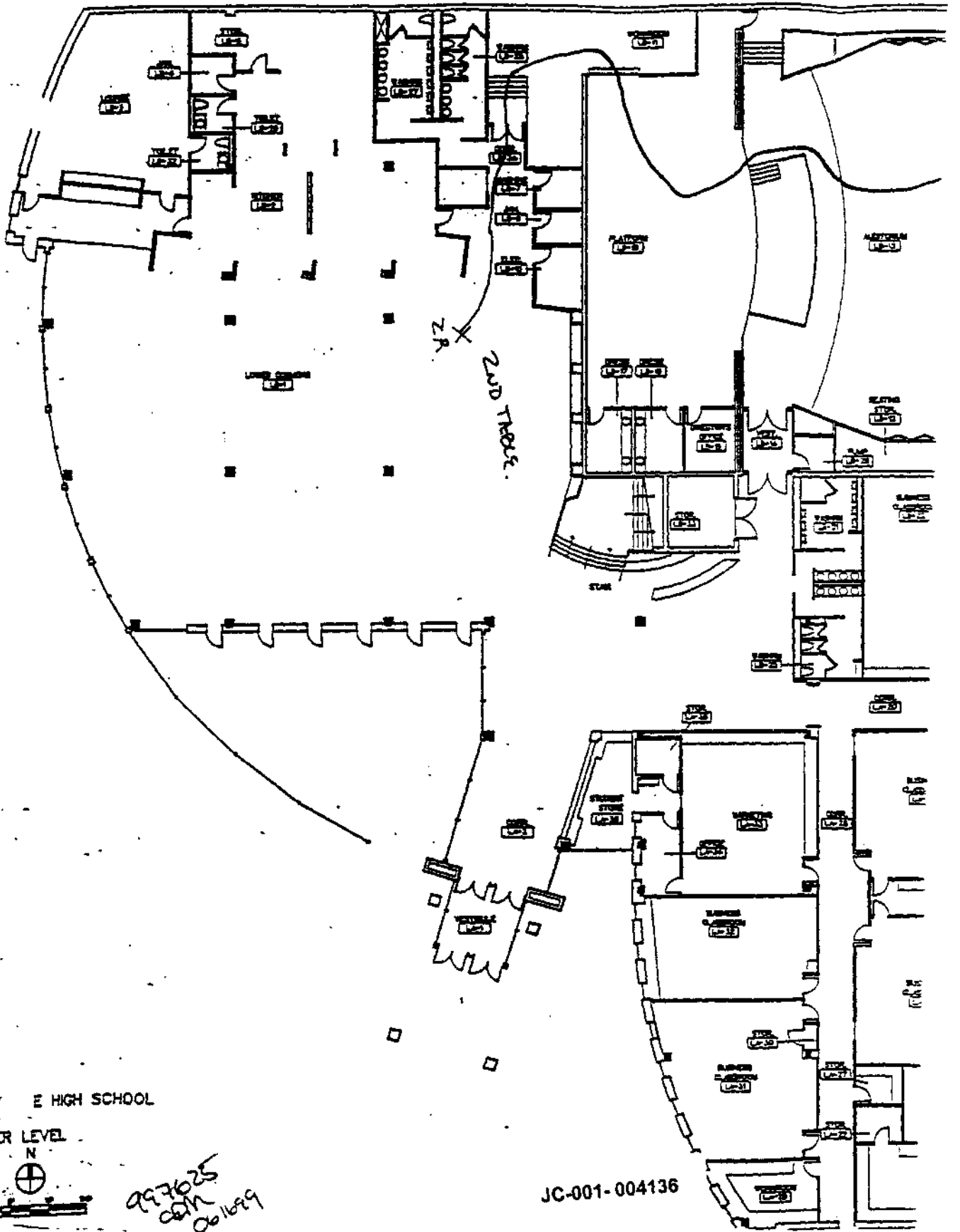
Zachary Rauzi then left and I continued speaking with his mother Doreen Rauzi. She stated that Matthew Kechter was one of Zachary Rauzi's best friends and this has been very difficult for him.

It should be noted that when I handed Zachary Rauzi the diagram showing the larger portion of Columbine High School, he started drawing in the area of the library, believing it to be the cafeteria. I then explained to him that this was the upper level of the school and he then started in the auditorium area. I drew an "X" through this location, where he initially was drawing in the library

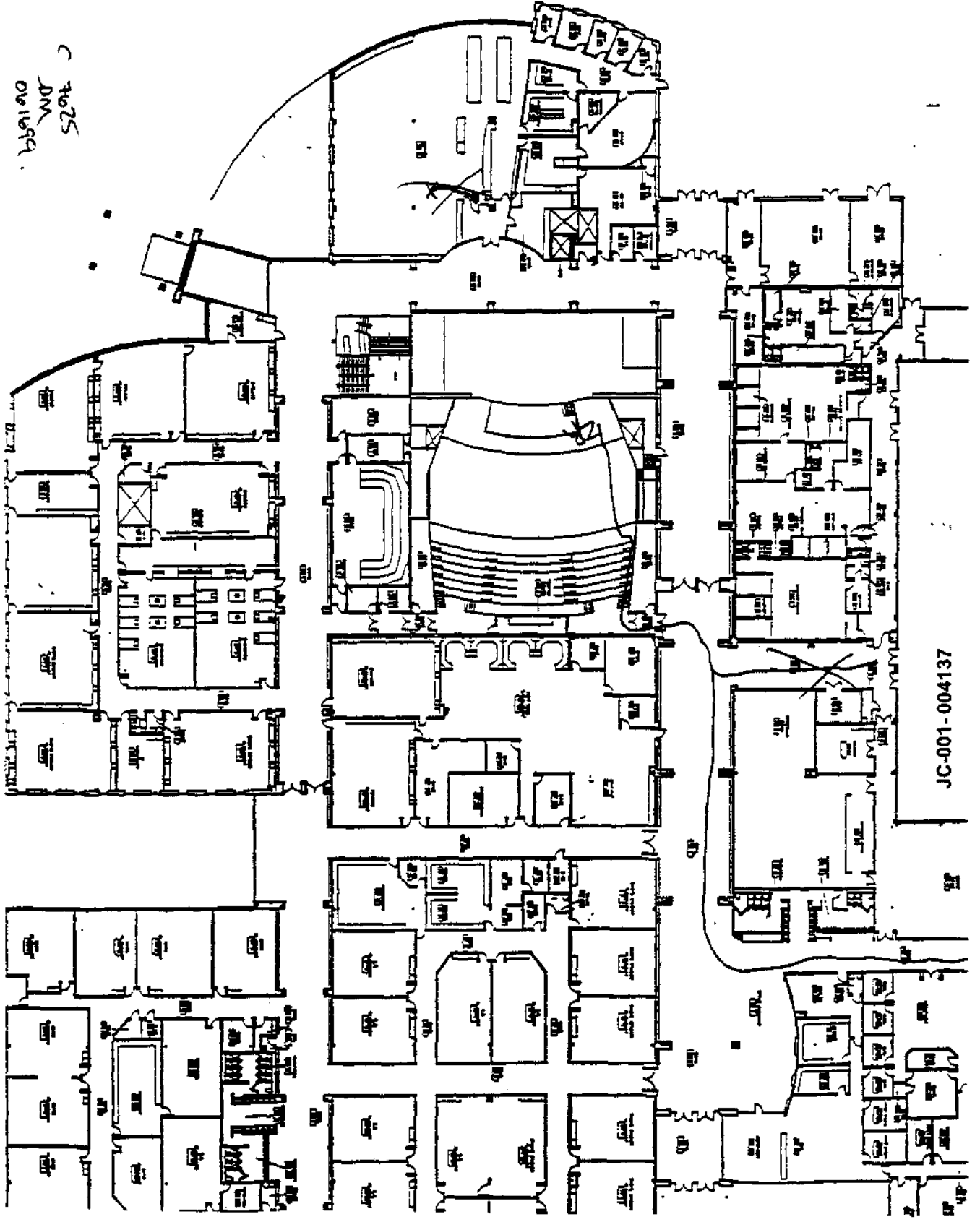

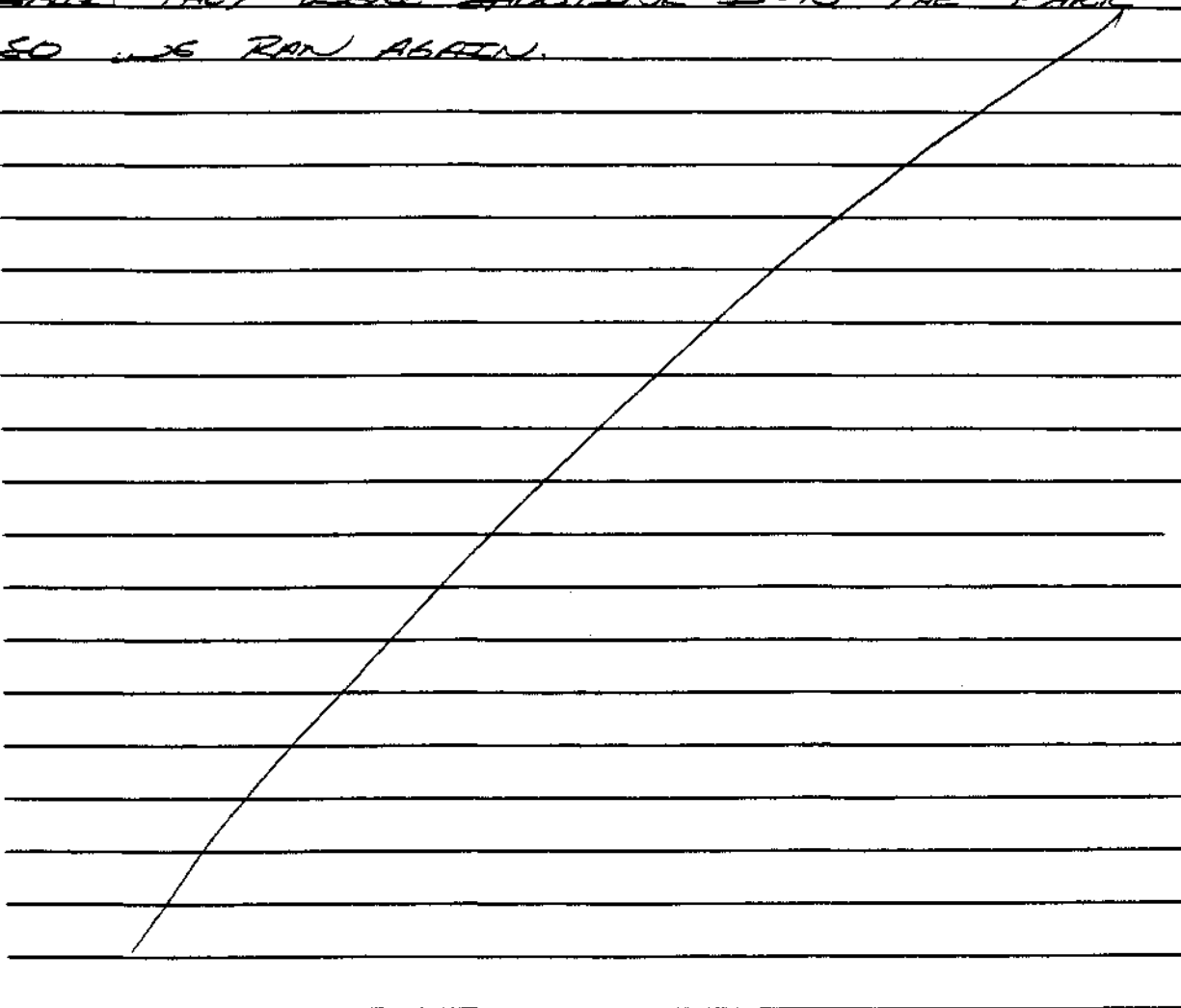

INVESTIGATION:

On May 17, 1999 at 1930 hours I contacted Nicole Ray at her home for an interview. Her parents were present. Nicole then told me the following:

\* She is a freshman at Columbine High.

\* She was recently interviewed over the phone by an unknown detective about her knowledge of hearing a Melissa Sowder talk in class after the shooting that Sowder thought the shooting was funny and that the victims deserved it. She was also interviewed about her knowledge of a Daniel Romero and Tiffany Lien saying that they heard Melissa Sowder say she knew the shooting would happen two weeks before it did.

\* When asked about Eric Harris, she said that she has seen him around school but did not know his name prior to the shooting. She only saw him a couple of times and did not know anything about him.

\* When asked about Dylan Klebold, she said that she had never seen him nor did she ever hear his name before.

\* She did not know [REDACTED]

\* When asked about [REDACTED], she said that she thought that was the student she heard people say hi to that was a nice guy. She described [REDACTED] as looking like Dracula. She said this student wore black eye make-up. She did not know anything about him.

\* When asked about [REDACTED], she said that she knew his name from the yearbook and that she saw him around school at times. She looked in her yearbook and then said that the person she thought she knew as [REDACTED] was actually an ex-trench coat wearer named Patrick McDuffy. She said that she saw McDuffy on television talking about this shooting.

\* She said that the trench coat students would hang out under the cafeteria stairs.

\* When asked about associates, she said that a freshman named Jennifer Faller was an "outcast" that may be associated with the trench coats. She also said that a sophomore named Jessica Rusch was also an "outcast" who may have hung out with trench coat students.

\* She said that she never saw much of the trench coat students at school. She has heard of the "Trench Coat Mafia" but just thought they were a group.

\* When asked, she did not see any trench coat student or associate in school the day of the shooting. She did say that she saw a male student, who used to hang out with Robert Perry, on the morning of the shooting. She said she saw this student prior to 4th hour by a locker on the south hallway wall of the science area between the interior science hallways. She said this student was a "big fat guy" who wore chains and fashioned his hair into horns.

\* On the day of the shooting she did not see any suspicious objects around school or the cafeteria. When asked specifically, she did not see any duffle bags.

\* On the day of the shooting, she had 4th hour off and spent that time in the cafeteria with her friends. After she got out of Miss Mosier's 3rd hour science class at 10:20 a.m. she walked with Amy Stone to her locker. She then met up with several other friends in the area by the gym. She then went to the cafeteria.

\* Upon looking at the diagram, she said that she spent 4th hour and the lunch hour at table II. The backpack list showed her backpack recovered at table II.

\* She spent the 4th hour with Naiome Lucero, Natalie Baker, Lauren Moulten, Kelsy Fowler, Tina Thorsen, and Bay (last name unknown).

\* She then stayed in the cafeteria for lunch. She went to the food lines and then back to table II. She was at the table for lunch with Naiome Lucero, Natalie Baker, Kelsy Fowler, Brittany Gillette, Jule Nasland, and Megan Piro. She said several other friends were within her table and two others that she and her friends usually sit at.


\* She said that she saw Mr. Sanders running in the cafeteria from the west door area telling people to get down that there were people with guns. She got under her table. She said that some students were getting up and she heard yelling for them to get down.

\* She then heard a "pop" but did not know from where it came. She said that everyone started running out of the cafeteria so she ran also.


\* She ran up the stairs with Julie Nasland. When they got to the top of the stairs, Julie started to go to the right, toward the library. She grabbed Julie who was falling at times and went left from the stairs and out the school via the east doors to that hallway. As she was running down the hallway, she thought she heard bullets hitting lockers and ceiling pieces falling.

\* She ran with Julie to Leawood Park. She heard more "pops" and ran further to a lady's house on Lamar Street named Bonnie.

CHS student, cafeteria witness

On May 16, 1999, this investigator met with Allison Reardon at her residence. Present during the interview were her parents, Gerard and Cheryl Reardon.

Allison advised that on the day of this incident, she arrived in the cafeteria between 11:10 and 11:15 a.m., having come from her fourth hour science class. She was shown a sketch of the cafeteria and indicated that she had been seated at the table marked "KK." She said others at her table were: Laura Green, Jenny Taylor, Lindsey Kastanek and Shannon Myers. She advised that within just a few minutes, she observed a number of boys who had been seated near her table get up and run toward the area of the Rebel Corner. She said she then saw one of the school janitors come through the cafeteria, telling the students to get down, that someone had a gun. She stated that she heard "popping" sounds, but did not know what they were. She then saw Mr. Sanders in the cafeteria and at that time, many of the students began running up the stairs to the upper level of the school. Allison said that she too ran up the stairs and

then down the hallway which goes between the math and social studies hall, east out of the school, and into the park across the street - Leawood Park. She advised that while there, she heard explosions and what she thought were gunshots. She said she ran out of the park into the neighborhood and eventually found a friend's residence - she could not recall that person's name.

Allison stated that she had never heard of the trench coat mafia prior to that day. She knew none of the individuals associated with that group. She advised that she never heard of any rumors relating to this incident.

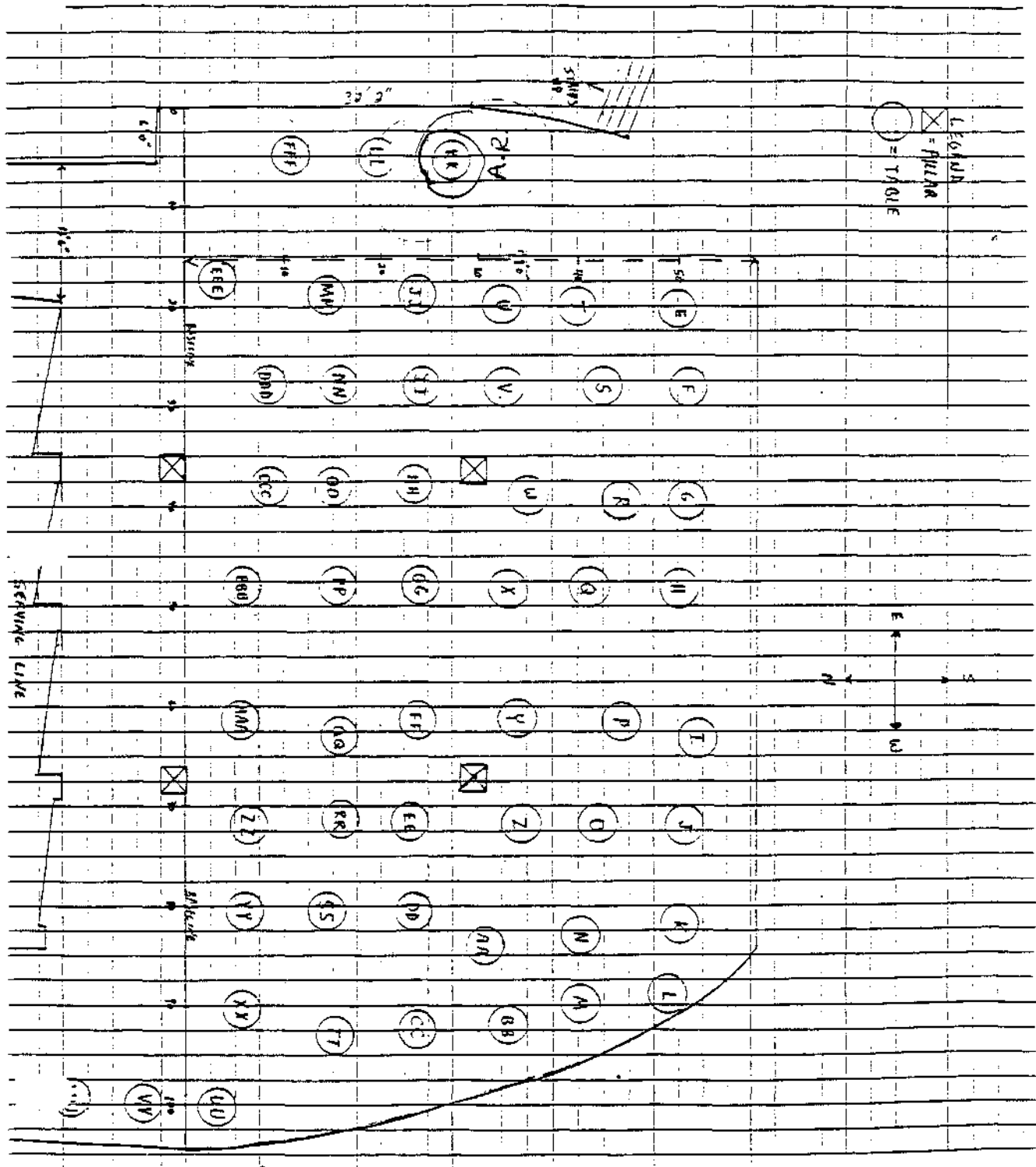

**INVESTIGATION:**

On 04-28-99 I was assigned Information Control Number DN1434 for follow up investigation. I reviewed the Information Control narrative which indicated that Linda Rebrovic had called to report that her daughter had been in the cafeteria when the shooting had begun at Columbine High School.

On 04-30-99 at 0900 hours, I responded to 5476 South Everett Way where I met with Kate Rebrovic and her parents. Kate told me that she had driven to the school with friend, Beth Bradshaw, who is a junior at the high school. She said that they arrived at approximately 0715-0720 hours and that they parked in the student parking lot near the senior section. She believes her parking space number is 315. She said that they went in through the student entrance and went to the Language Arts department which is directly down the hall. Kate Rebrovic said that she then went to her first hour class, which is choir. The choir room is on the main floor. She then went to her second hour class, which is government, again, on the main floor. She then went to her third hour class, which is Spanish on the lower level. Her fourth hour class is math on the main floor. Kate said that between third hour and fourth hour she went to her locker between classes.

When fourth hour math was over, Kate Rebrovic attends the "A" lunch period. She left math with her friend Laura Farber. She said that they stopped at Laura's locker which is in the math hall, and believes that they arrived

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in the cafeteria sometime between 1110-1115 hours. She said that they had table in the student entrance next to the cafeteria and that they had the last table by door. She said that when she arrived at the table everyone was already there. She had brought her lunch and she sat down and began eat. She placed her backpack on the ledge above the table.

She said that Steve, Mike and Travis got up to go get their lunch. She said that Travis gets his lunch at the "rebel counter" and he usually waits until the line goes down before he goes up and gets it. Kate Rebrovic said that she had just started eating her lunch, that she had eaten her apples and grapes but had not eaten her sandwich, when she heard people yelling there is a fight. She said that people on the west end of the cafeteria ran to the window while other students ran out the exit on the south side of the cafeteria. She said that almost immediately students were running back into the cafeteria yelling, "they've got guns. go back inside the building". She said that she had stood up to look out the window and she heard sounds that she thought might be gunshots and she heard people yelling "get down, get down". She said that everybody got down but Travis was still standing up. They told him to get down and teachers also yelled at everybody to get down. She said a short time after that people started to run up the stairs and she heard people yelling "get out, get out". She said there was a janitor and Mr. Cappra, a cross-country coach, and Mr. Ortiz, the softball coach, who guided them out the student entry doors through the parking lot behind the school.

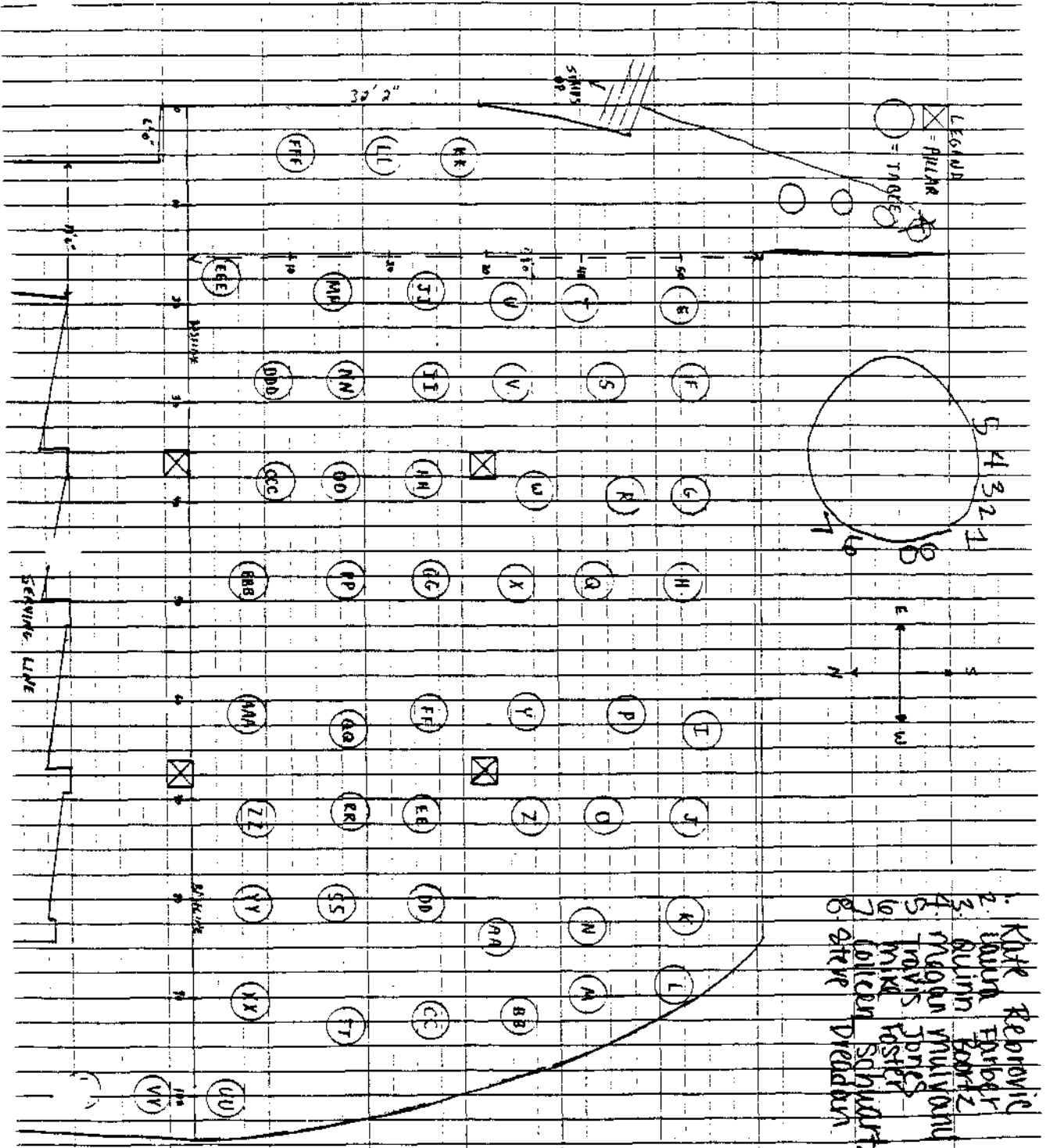
Once they were in the parking lot, she said that they could heard explosions and gunshots as they were running away from the school. She said that once they got out of the school she went to Travis Jones' house.

Kate Rebrovic said that her backpack is blue, an Eastpack, and has a key chain that says, "Paris, France". She said that she left the backpack on the ledge by the windows, by the table where she was sitting. She said that the backpack contains four binders, a Spanish folder, a math text book, a geography book, a reading book, a calculator, pens and pencils and her purse, a protractor and a compass.

Kate Rebrovic said that she was wearing a Khaki shirt with cargo pockets, pants and sandals.

Kate Rebrovic said that she knew who the "trench coat mafia" were, but did not know them by name until after the incident. She said that she had seen kids in the school wearing the long, dark trench coats. Rebrovic said that she does not seeing anything that strikes her now as being unusual in the school prior to the incident occurring on 04-20-99. She did not see any large duffle bags in the cafeteria and did not see any propane tanks. She has not heard of any other students or suspects talk about bomb making or gun buying.

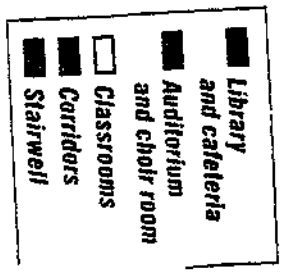
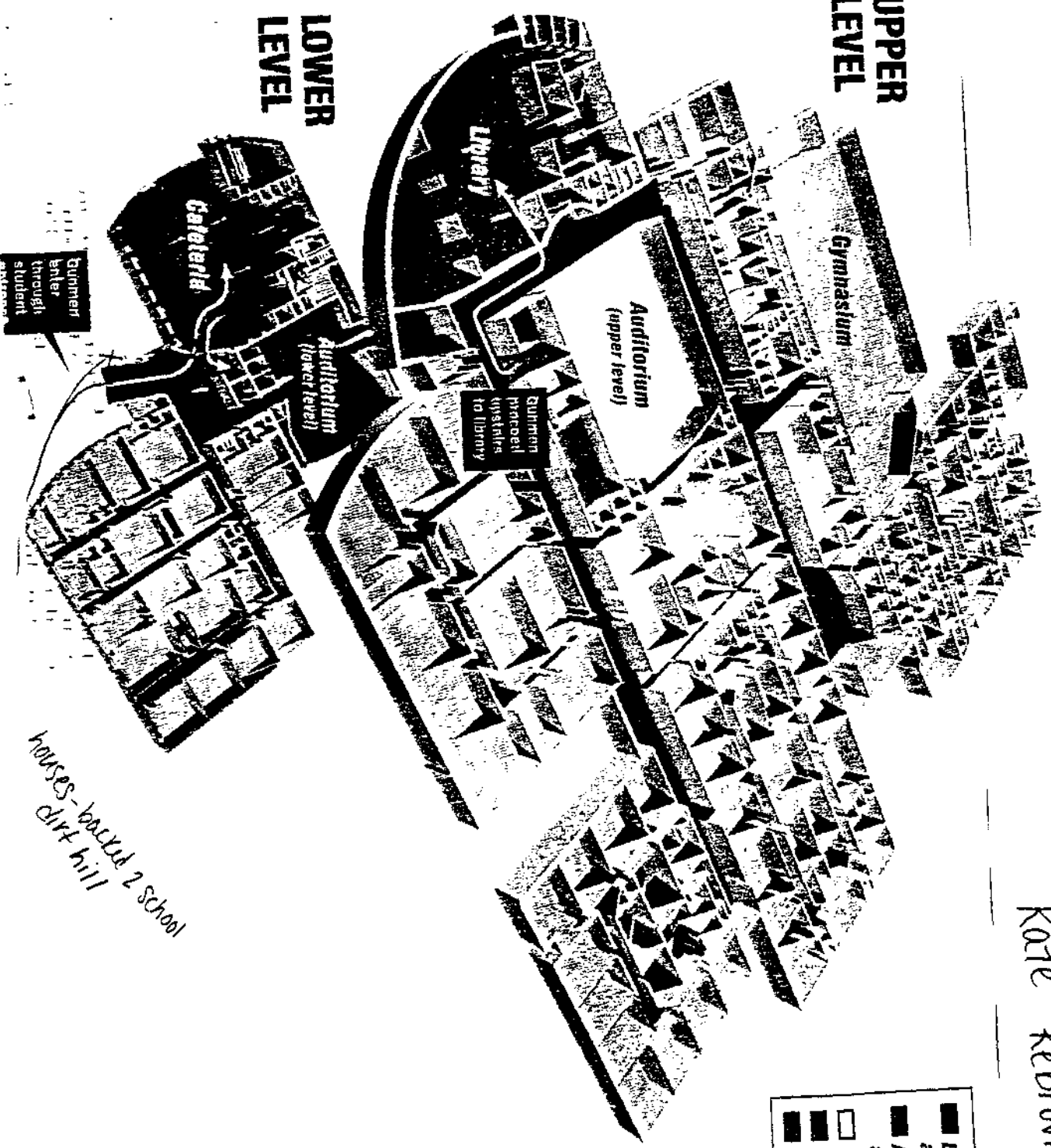

**INVESTIGATION:**

On 05-14-99, at about 12:25 p.m., I interviewed CHS teacher Christina (Chris) Redmerski as follow up on DN3331. The interview was conducted at Christina's home.

Chris told me that on 04-20-99, at about 11:10 a.m., she had just finished teaching her fourth period Earth Science class in the Science wing on the school's upper level. Chris said that when class ended, she grabbed her sack lunch, which she always brings, from the classroom and walked downstairs, across the cafeteria and into the faculty lounge. Chris said that she normally enters the cafeteria from the interior stairway and walks north, past tables KK, LL and FFF, then west, next to and parallel with the serving line, to the faculty lounge. Chris said that this day was no different, and estimated that she arrived inside the faculty lounge at about 11:12 a.m. Chris said that when she entered the faculty lounge, teachers Dave Sanders and Judy Greco were already there and seated at a table near the southeast corner of the room. Chris said that the three of them "religiously" eat lunch together, and follow the same routine nearly every day. Chris said that the three of them were the only teachers inside the faculty lounge at that time. She drew a map of the interior of the faculty lounge to indicate where the tables / fixtures were located, and where the three of them sat. Chris indicated that she sat at the above table with her back to the window.

Chris said that the three of them then began to eat their lunch, and that she had eaten about half of her sandwich when they heard

a knocking sound on the window of the faculty lounge. Chris said that the three of them ignored this sound because they assumed students outside were hitting the window, as they were known to do. Chris said that a couple of seconds later, they heard a second knocking sound on the window, which was also ignored. Chris said they then heard a third knocking sound which was "a lot stronger and louder" than the first two, and sounded as though someone had forcefully "pounded" on the window. At this point, Chris said that the three of them were thinking that the students "were getting out of control out there," and that she decided to go outside and tell them to "knock it off." Chris said that she then stood up and walked toward the west doorway to the faculty lounge, next to the window. Chris said that as she reached the doorway, still inside the lounge, she looked out the window and saw two students lying "facing the window, on their stomachs" directly outside and below the window. Chris said that the two students were about four feet apart and parallel to each other. Chris said she then heard "some raucous" outside and assumed there was / had been a fight. Chris said that she did not say anything to Dave Sanders or Judy Greco at that time.

Chris said that she then exited the west doorway of the faculty lounge and walked to the door located at the northwest corner of the cafeteria. Chris said that she then opened the door (the hinges of which were to her left) and stood in the doorway while holding the door open with her left arm. At that time, Chris said that she saw a student lying in front of the door, at an angle with his head facing northeast and his feet pointing southwest. Chris said that she could not see the student's face at that time and could hear loud talking / yelling from other kids nearby. Chris said that she then looked at the student on the ground in front of her and asked him, "What are you doing on the ground?" Chris said that in her mind, she was thinking that this student had been in a fight and/or had been pushed, and was perhaps "exaggerating" his injury. Chris said that upon asking him this, he "looked at me and said, 'I can't feel my legs.'" Chris then said, "What do you mean you can't feel your legs?" Chris said that up to this point, she had heard no gunshots or anything else that would indicate something other than horseplay. Chris said that the student didn't answer her, so she asked, "Did you fall?" Chris said that he said, "No, I can't feel my legs." Chris then asked, "Did you have a seizure? Did you trip or something?" Again, Chris said that he said, "No, I can't feel my legs." Chris said that the student was becoming visibly irritated with her for asking why he couldn't feel his legs. She then asked, "Did somebody push you? Were you in a fight?" Chris said that he kept repeating the same answer and occasionally cursed. Chris said that she, too, was becoming irritated and finally said, "Look, I'm confused here. You're lying on the ground. Why are

you on the ground, and why can you not feel your legs?" Chris said that he then said, "I think I've been shot." Upon hearing this, Chris said that she was somewhat dumfounded and said, "You think you've been shot? Where were you shot?" Chris said that as she was looking at him, she did not see any blood on or near him, nor any other visible signs of injury. Chris said that he then said, "I think I've been shot in the back." Chris then asked, "Well, who shot you?" Chris said that he then said, "Up on the hill, there's a kid in a black trench coat. He shot me." Chris said that she was still holding the door open at this time and was preparing to stick her head around the corner to her right and look up toward the hill. Chris said that she then "took one step out" of the doorway, and immediately heard a series of gunshots coming from "outside the school." Chris said that at that point, she remembered looking at Sean and saying to him, "I'll be right back."

Chris said that she then ran back into the west doorway of the faculty lounge, where Dave Sanders and Judy Greco were still the only ones inside, and still eating their lunch. Chris said that she yelled at Dave, "Help me! A student's been shot and I can't move him!" Chris said that Dave then stood up, and Judy immediately ran to the phone on the desk along the east wall of the lounge. Chris said that she does not recall which door of the faculty lounge Dave then exited. Chris said that she then returned to the cafeteria's northwest door to get back to Sean. Chris said that in her mind, she needed to get Sean back inside the building to protect him. Chris said that she then crawled into the doorway, holding the door open with her left arm. Chris said that she then laid down on her stomach, and told Sean to "give me your hand." Chris said that she remembers a custodian named Jon (Curtis) came to the doorway behind her, and that she looked back to him and said, "I can't pull him in, he's too big." She also remembers seeing Dave Sanders and Judy Greco behind her in the doorway as well, but could not recall when they left or where they went. Chris said that Jon then crouched in the doorway to help her, but was interrupted by a female "cafeteria worker" who came to the door and yelled at her and John "not to move him (Sean), that he may have spinal damage."

Chris said that she looked at the cafeteria worker and remembers being "so aggravated." Chris said that she told the cafeteria worker, "He already can't move his legs! What's the difference? I can't leave him out there, there's shooting outside! He needs to get back into the school!" Chris said that at that point, she heard several gunshots coming from very nearby. Chris said that she thinks the glass windows along the northwest side of the cafeteria were then shot out. Chris said that she continued to lie on her stomach and look at Sean, but could hear the sound of glass breaking. Chris said that she continued to lie in the doorway

and focus her attention on Sean. Chris said that her sense of time became distorted, and that she couldn't say how long she remained there. Chris said that while lying there, she remembered seeing "a blond girl with a white top" lying on her stomach, her head toward the school, below the cafeteria windows between the first (largest) and second (smaller) square patches of grass. Chris said that she did not know if this girl got shot, or simply heard the shots and got down. Chris said that as she laid in the doorway, she remembered yelling at other students outside the cafeteria to "Get down! They're shooting!" Chris also remembered seeing a student, whom she identified as Veronica Nuncio (11th), walking around the southwest exterior corner of the cafeteria. Chris said that Veronica was "kind of laughing and smiling," and didn't appear to know what was going on. Chris said that she remembered yelling, "Veronica get down! They're shooting!" Chris said that she saw Veronica drop down to the ground. Chris said that she continued to hear sporadic gunshots during this time. Chris said that although she does not remember this, she was later told by (custodian) Jon Curtis that a window next to the doorway in which she was lying was blown out during this time. Chris does not know which window he was referring to. Chris said that at some point, she remembered Jon yelling at her to leave Sean because there was shooting occurring inside the school, and that it "no longer mattered." Chris said that John told her that he would stay with Sean, and for her to get back inside.

After that, Chris said that she remembered crawling backward, out of the doorway and into the cafeteria. Chris said that she remembered seeing the door, which she had been holding open with her left arm, begin to close and actually hit Sean on the head. Whereas Sean had originally been outside the door's pathway, he had apparently been pulled toward the doorway enough that his head now obstructed its path. Chris said that as she moved backward, she saw blood on the concrete near Sean's back. Chris said that once she was out of the doorway and back inside, she stood up and ran into the faculty lounge by way of its east doorway. Chris said that as she entered the faculty lounge, she saw Judy Greco and students Araceli Gaucin and Michelle Huff huddled together near the two soda machines which are located on the lounge's south wall, between the two doorways. Chris said that Dave Sanders was not inside the lounge at that time. Chris said that she remembered yelling to Judy and the students, "You've got to get out of here, they're in the building!"

Chris said that from that point, she could not remember much except that she ended up in the rear ("as far back as I could go") of the kitchen, up against the walk-in freezer doors. Chris said that she was by herself at that time, and that Judy, Araceli

Michelle, and a couple of kitchen workers were to her right, huddled together. Chris said that she remembered Judy calling to her, telling her to come over to where they were. Chris said that she remained where she was, thinking that if she moved her back would be exposed to anyone looking down the kitchen aisle. Chris said that during this time, she could hear loud "booms" coming from somewhere across the serving line inside the cafeteria, along with periodic gunshots and the sound of people yelling and screaming. Chris said that smoke quickly became "very thick" inside the kitchen area, but that she could see and hear some of the custodians crawling near the serving line to see where the shooters were. Chris estimated that she and the others remained in the rear of the kitchen for about forty-five minutes, and that at some point, a custodian named Jay (Gallentine) arrived at their location and said that he was going to try to see if he could get some of the closets opened and get them inside. Chris said that Jay told them that if worse came to worse, they could go inside the walk-in freezer "where it wouldn't be comfortable, but it would be safe."

Chris said that Jay then tried to open a storage room door along the north wall of the kitchen, but could not get it open and said that there must already be kids inside. Chris said that Jay then unlocked a "mop closet" door located along the west wall of the kitchen, and noticed several people inside. Chris said that Jay then shoved two kitchen workers inside this closet, along with Judy, Araceli, Michelle, herself and another teacher named Eric Kritzer. Chris said that Eric Kritzer had arrived in the kitchen about ten minutes prior to that, and that he said he had been wounded in the leg, apparently from shrapnel from an explosive device made from a beer can. Chris said that Jay then told them to stay inside the closet, and locked the door from the outside.

Chris said that she thinks there were a total of seventeen people inside this mop closet. She then provided a list that she had since prepared of all the individuals who were inside the closet with her: Shawn Roberts (11th), Austin Mears (10th), Greg Garcia (10th), Paul Andrews (10th), Michelle Huff (11th), Araceli Gaucin (11th), Matt Sesow (9th), Kristin (last name unknown, Greg's girlfriend), Tony Arnold (custodian), Sue Dewlaney, Linda Tibljas, Marlene Nederman, LaVerne Helm (kitchen workers), Chris Redmerski, Judy Greco, and Eric Kritzer (teachers). Chris said that (custodian) Tony Arnold had a walkie-talkie with him during the time they were all inside the closet. Chris said that Tony periodically used the walkie-talkie to remain in contact with others who had them, and knew when the SWAT team(s) had entered the school. Chris said that they all remained inside this closet for about two hours. Chris said that during this time, and particularly early on, she heard periodic

muffled "booms" and "crashing and banging" noises coming from above, which she thought would have been the library area. Chris also said that they sometimes heard voices coming from outside the door, in the kitchen area, and someone talking about how the 'door was locked' and that the 'key was broken.' Chris said that during their last hour inside the closet, they heard a voice coming from directly outside the closet door, pleading for them to open the door and let him in. Chris said that she did not recognize this voice, but that student Greg Garcia said it was his friend, Brett Kostalnick (10th). Chris said that this individual told them his name was Brett, and even passed his school ID card under the door to prove who he was. Despite this, Chris said that they did not let him inside out of fear that he might be a shooter. Chris said that approximately thirty minutes later, they heard noises coming from above the mop closet, and then saw fingers attempting to pry open the ceiling tiles above them. Chris said that they turned off the light inside the closet and huddled together, fearing the worst. Chris said that it turned out to be Brett Kostalnick, and that they told him to stay put. Chris said that he remained there, in the rafters, for about thirty minutes, then left.

Chris said that it was after 2:30 p.m. that they got out of the closet because she remembered hearing the 2:30 p.m. (dismissal) bell, and looking at her watch. Chris said that she remembered a SWAT team cracking open the door and announcing themselves. Chris said that it took longer than they had expected to clear the room because of the cramped conditions. Chris said that upon leaving the closet, she and the others were ushered back into the faculty lounge, searched, and lined up against the west wall. Chris said that while she was lined up against said wall, SWAT members became concerned that someone was crawling around above the ceiling tiles, aimed their guns at the ceiling, and quickly ushered she and the others out the broken lounge window in groups of three. From there, Chris said that she and the others ran up the exterior stairway to safety.

Chris said that at no time did she see any shooter(s) or anyone wearing a trench coat. She said that when she entered the cafeteria, after fourth period, she did not see any duffle bag(s) or anything else that looked suspicious / out of the ordinary. The interview concluded at about 1:25 p.m.

A lead sheet was prepared and submitted by me for kitchen worker LaVerne Helm. All other names were indicated by Rapid Start as having already been interviewed, or scheduled to be interviewed.

**INVESTIGATION:**

On Thursday, 07-08-99, at approximately 1330 hours, I contacted witness Regnier at her residence by telephone. I asked her to provide any relevant information she could about the incident occurring at Columbine High School on 04-20-99. Witness Regnier advised that during fifth hour, she was proceeding to walk to the faculty lounge from the Foreign Language hallway and was directly in front of the first station where kids pay for lunch in the cafeteria. She advised that she noticed the custodian, Tony (last name unknown) had come into the cafeteria and said, "Get down, they've got a gun." She indicated shortly after this time, teacher Dave Sanders also came in and said something to the effect, of "Get down, they've got guns." She indicated that she did get down on the floor and heard a "boom, boom sound." She indicated that it did not sound like a rifle or pistol, but more of a bomb type device. She indicated that she believed this sound was coming from outside. She said that while she was on the ground, she heard glass shattering but was unsure as to where it was breaking. She looked up and saw students scurrying around the cafeteria area, running in all directions. She advised that she managed to make her way to the hallway where the elevator is located adjacent to the cafeteria and began to pull students off the elevator and out of the bathrooms in that area because they were not safe places to hide. She indicated that two other teachers and approximately 75 students were in the immediate area when another teacher named Leland Andres (spelling unknown) had opened the back door to the stage area adjacent to the auditorium. She indicated that all these people ran into the auditorium and some students proceeded to go up these stairs of the auditorium and out those doors. She said that those particular students immediately returned and said something to the effect that the suspects were up in that area. It is unknown if they had seen or heard shooting in that particular area, but they did run back down to the bottom of the auditorium. She advised that Leland had locked the doors to the auditorium and they began to

place the students behind seats within the auditorium. She said shortly after that time another custodian, Jay (last name unknown) came in and said that they needed to leave the area as he was informed by radio that the suspects were in the immediate area. She indicated that she and the other teachers lined the students up and they proceeded down the Foreign Language hallway and out the fire exit door which leads onto the student parking lot on the south side of the building. She indicated that all this occurred within approximately five minutes, at which time the fire alarm sounded. She said that she had escorted all the students over to the Leawood Park area and stayed there for approximately one half to one hour directing traffic away from the school that was headed down West Fair Avenue toward the school. She said that after a period of time, she went to the Columbine Public Library to assist with students and parents and eventually obtained a ride from another teacher to her residence. Witness Regnier did not provide any additional information.

**INVESTIGATION**

On 4-27-99, between the hours of 0932 and 1050, I had an opportunity to speak with Brock reference the incident that occurred that Columbine H.S. on 4-20-99. Also present at the interview was his step-mother, Kristine.


Brock stated on 4-20-99, after he was released from his 3rd period class at about 10:20 a.m. which was the American Government class taught by Mr. Savino, that he went to Subway's located at Pierce and Coal Mine with his friends, Jacki Carrol and Jill Kamens. Brock explained he does not have a fourth hour class and he will normally go down to the cafeteria area where he will study or eat an early lunch. He stated after he and his friends exited Columbine H.S. they went to Clement Park where Jackie drove them to the Subway at Pierce and Coal Mine. After picking up their lunch they returned to the school, and entered through the main door, and walked down the main hall right past the library, and proceeded down the stairs to the cafeteria. He said he

believes they were back in the school by 10:35 a.m. When they arrived at the cafeteria, after showing him a map of the cafeteria, he said they sat at table "HH." Brock was asked after arriving at the cafeteria if he remembers observing two large duffel bags or gym type bags. One described as blue in color and the other an orange-ish/red in the general area where he was seated, or if he observed anyone bringing these items in there and leaving them. He stated he did not see the items and he did not see anybody bring the items in. Brock was asked who else was at the table with him or in the vicinity. He stated that Keith Nackerud, Tony Sonderby, later he provided Tony's phone number, 303-978-1778, and his address of 5514 West Alder Ave. He also told me at the table were Brian (unk last name) who is a sophomore, and Tyler, also a sophomore. He stated at the time there was about 100 people in the cafeteria. Brock stated about 11:15 a.m. is when he first heard some loud "pops" telling me the pops were near the north/west entrance to the cafeteria. He initially described the pops as firecrackers. Shortly after that he recalled that a janitor came running into the cafeteria. He described the janitor as white male, with a Columbine baseball cap and t-shirt on, skinny, and the janitor was yelling to the students to get out of the cafeteria area. Brock then describes seeing two individuals enter the north/west doors of the cafeteria. The first party he describes as being 5'6"-5'8", white male with a white t-shirt on, faded black or blue jeans. This individual was not wearing a face mask and did not have a black trench coat on. He stated it is unknown if this individual was a part of this incident, telling me that this party did not have a weapon. The second party he described seeing enter the door was about 5'10"-5'11", telling me the individual was wearing a black trench coat, and had a face mask on. He stated this individual was carrying a weapon. He described the weapon as a double barrel shotgun, and that the party had a dark colored backpack on. Initially when this individual entered into the cafeteria, Brock stated the party was walking along the west windows, and then started running towards the stairs which were located on the east side of the cafeteria. After seeing this individual Brock stated that he and several other individuals started to walk towards the stairs and behind them they could hear gun fire. They believed it was coming from the individual who had entered the cafeteria from the north/west doors.

Brock stated as they started to walk up the stairs from the cafeteria they past a second gunman who he stated was Dylan Klebold. He stated he passed within six feet of Dylan, on the stairs as he continued upstairs en route to the tech lab. Brock described Dylan Klebold as 6'4" to 6'5", stating Dylan was wearing a black trench coat. He had a face mask on which covered the top of his head and down just below his nose. Dylan was wearing his favorite hat, a Boston Red Sox's hat, which was turned around backwards and that the "B" which is normally on the front of the cap was on the back side of the baseball cap, near the adjustment band. Brock stated that Dylan was carrying a large military type of gun and was moving real slowly, describing it as a "casual walk"

Brock stated that Dylan also had a black or navy blue backpack on. Brock was asked how he could positively identify this person as Dylan Klebold. He stated he has had contact with Dylan in the past because Dylan is such a fan of the Boston Red Sox's and they talked about the team before. He also stated that when he leaves his 3rd hour government class that he normally would pass Dylan in the hallway, because Dylan had that same class 4th period and they saw each other quite a bit, passing in the halls. He also stated that Dylan has a quite distinguishable chin, and there was no question when he saw Dylan on the stairs that he knew it was Dylan Klebold.

Brock stated he interrupted a class that was in progress in the tech lab. He stated that the teacher paused when he walked in and asked if he could help him at which time Brock told him there was somebody shooting, somebody walking around with a gun. Brock stated after he left the tech lab he went into the science lab room which is adjacent to the tech lab. He stated that while he was in the science lab he remembers looking through the window in the science lab door, he stated he was about 12 feet back from the door and he remembers seeing an individual walking down the hall. He described that individual as being the same party he observed enter the north/west door in the cafeteria. Again he stated this individual was carrying a double barrel shotgun and was carrying the weapon in the ready position. After the individual passed by the door Brock stated he exited from the science room and ran east passed the tech lab. He stated when he exited from the science room the suspect was to his left as if he was walking towards the west. Brock remembers running north to the Woods hallway at which time he exited from the school, stating that he ran towards the smokers pit, jumped the fence and ran north to Clement Park.

Brock was asked if observed either of the gunmen inside the Columbine H.S. fire the weapon. He stated he heard gun fire, but he wasn't sure where they were shooting and he never saw the individuals shoot at anyone. He also told me that while he was in the tech lab and science lab area that he could hear explosions throughout the school.

Brock was asked if he had any additional information about the Trench Coat Mafia. He said the only thing he knew was that he believed that Dylan Klebold was the leader of the group and Dylan was seeking revenge against "jocks." He stated he did not know Eric Harris and he didn't know any additional members of the group.

reiterated he did not see either of the suspect firing their weapons while in the school. Brock was asked if he had any additional information to provide. He stated one thing of interest that about three weeks ago, somebody had glued the interior and exterior box, using epoxy glue which rendered the locks unusable. He stated for about a week to a week and half the school did not have means to secure the classrooms or the doors leading in and out of the school.

Brock was asked to describe his dress on Tuesday, 4-20-99. He stated he was wearing blue jeans, a white t-shirt and over the white t-shirt was a kaiki colored sleeveless vest with a blue pin stripes, and wearing tan shoes and CSU baseball cap on. Brock was asked if he left any additional items at Columbine School. He stated other than his backpack and notebooks which were left in the cafeteria that was it.



**INVESTIGATION:**

On 05-07-99, between the hours of 0857 and 0925 hours, I had an opportunity to speak with Courtney Reynolds in reference to the incident that occurred at Columbine High School on 04-20-99. Also present during the interview were her parents, Gayle and Richard Reynolds.

Courtney Reynolds told me she arrived at school on 04-20-99, at about 0715 hours, and that she had car pooled with her friend, Pam. They arrived at the Junior parking lot, and proceeded into the school from the south entrance, which is also called REBEL corner. Once they entered into the school, they proceeded up the stairs to the main level of the school where they went to their lockers. Reynolds told me her locker is located in the front hall, and her locker number is 1300.

Reynolds' first period class was Math, which is located in Math room #MA11, and is taught by Ms. Layman; second period is French, which is taught by Ms. Lutz, in the Foreign Language hall and is located down near the cafeteria, just to the east. I asked Reynolds if she observed two large duffle bags or sports type bags in the cafeteria, or if she observed any individuals bring the bags in. The first bag was described as being blue in color, and the second bag was described as being an orangish/red in color. Reynolds stated she did not see the bags in the cafeteria area prior to lunch, and did not observe anyone bring the bags in. Reynolds told me her fourth hour class is a Chemistry class and is taught by Mr. Kent Friesen. After she was released from her



fourth period class, she went to the cafeteria for her scheduled lunch period, and believes she arrived at about 1112 hours. Reynolds was shown a map of the cafeteria, and was asked if she could tell me which table she sat at. She identified table #P as the table she was seated at, and she was seated with her friends, Michelle Marker (unknown phone), and Kristin Brown (303-988-0888). After Reynolds arrived at the table, she placed her backpack and a photo album on the table and proceeded to the food service line. Reynolds stated she went to the food service line which is the furthest west, near the northwest cafeteria doors. After she got her lunch, she proceeded back to her table. Shortly after she reached the table, she remembers seeing students, who were towards the west windows, get up and start to get underneath their table. Shortly after this, she recalls hearing an unidentified teacher yelling at the students to get down and get underneath the tables. Reynolds stated at first she thought it was a Senior prank, but not being sure what was going on, she got under the table. As she was getting under the table, she recalls seeing an unidentified white male enter the cafeteria from the south doors. She told me the person had short blond hair, was wearing a white t-shirt and blue jeans. She could see that the individual was bleeding from one of his arms, and once the party entered into the cafeteria, he sat down right by the door that he just entered in.

Reynolds told me a teacher by the name of Mr. Moore started yelling at the students to leave the building, at which time she started running towards the stairs. Reynolds said about mid-way up the stairs, she remembers hearing several gunshots, and the gunshots sounded as if they were coming from the Library area. Once she reached the top of the stairs, she ran east down the Math/Science hallways. About mid-point, she told me she fell, and there were several students who had fallen around her. She recalls an unidentified student helped her to her feet, at which time she continued to run east down the hallway, where she exited from the school and ran to Leawood Park. Once she reached Leawood Park, she heard gunshots and the sounds of explosions. Fearing that they were being shot at, the students continued to run east into the neighborhood. Reynolds told me she ran to the home of an unidentified police officer that was known by some of the people she was running with.

Reynolds was asked if she observed any gunmen while she was in Columbine High School or after she had exited from the school. She told me she did not observe any gunmen. Reynolds was asked if she knew the identity of any of the members of the Trench Coat Mafia, and if she had any information pertaining to Eric Harris or Dylan Klebold. She told me she did not know the two parties and that she did not have any information to provide about the group. She told me the only associate she knows that belongs to the Trench Coat Mafia is a girl by the name of Krista Hanley, and told me that Hanley was in the photographs

in the photo album that she had left on the table in the cafeteria, telling me that the photos were of a group of students that went France.

I had Reynolds describe what she was wearing on 04-20-99. She told me she was wearing a pair of overalls, a white shirt under them, and was wearing white tennis shoes. Reynolds was asked if there were any rumors going around school prior to the incident. She stated she did not hear anything. I asked her if she has heard any rumors or had any information after the incident which she felt she should pass on to me. She told me a friend of hers, Amanda Mendrall, told her she had heard from a friend of hers by the name of Lacey Smith, that there was a third gunman, not identified as Eric Harris or Dylan Klebold, and that this individual was a Senior who had either been suspended from school or had dropped out. Reynolds told me she could not remember the party's name, and that she did not have any additional information about this rumor. Reynolds also explained that she is on the yearbook staff, and there was a 1999 dedication to the Trench Coat Mafia on how to relieve tension, and the dedication was made by Robyn Anderson. Reynolds went on to say that this dedication had been turned over to law enforcement, as believed JCSO, as evidence.


At the completion of this interview, Reynolds was provided a map of the cafeteria area, and was asked if she could depict where she was sitting in the cafeteria and her travel path out of the cafeteria. A copy of that map is attached with this supplement report.

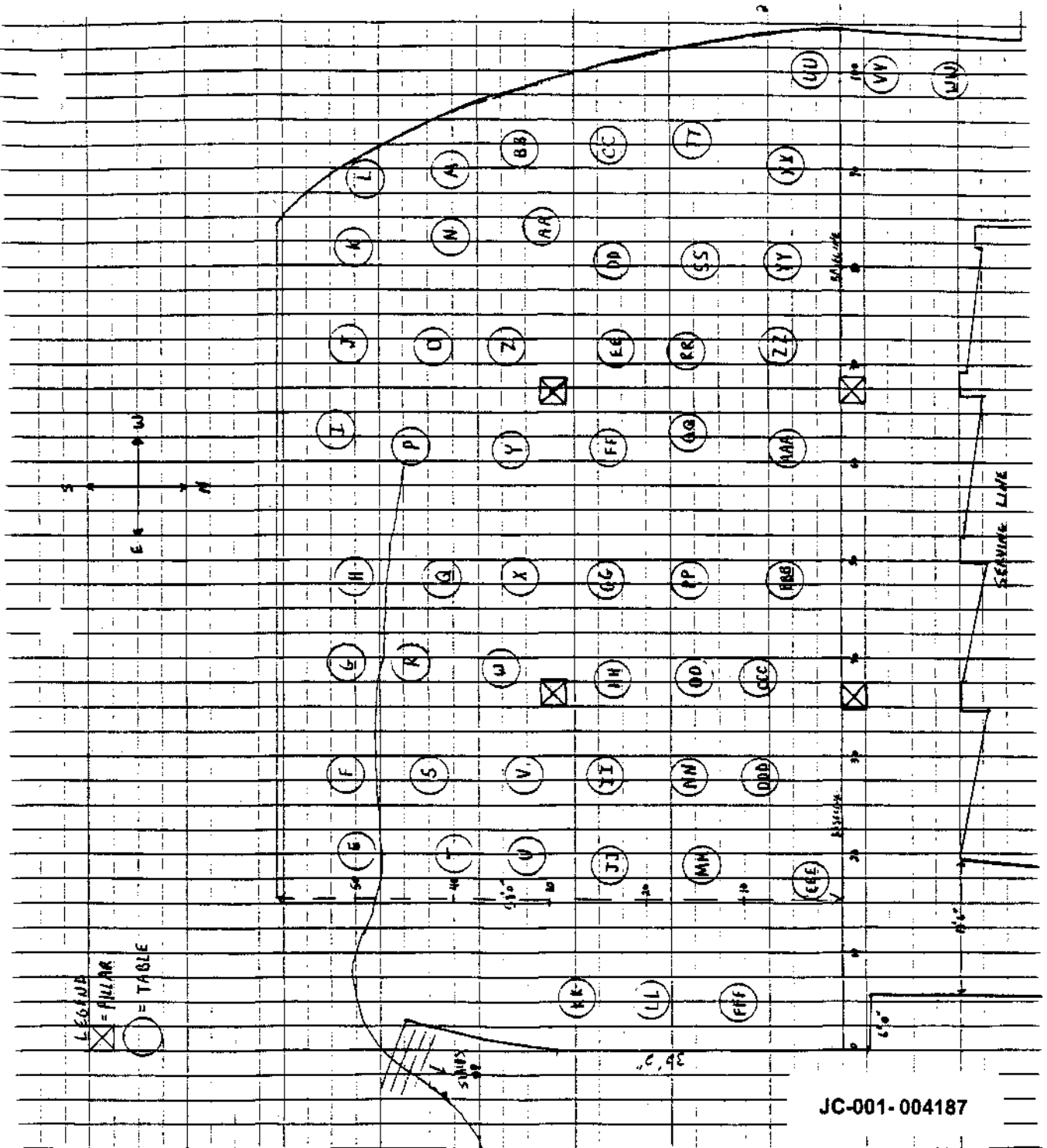

On 4/27/99, Lori Reynolds, DOB 9/23/83, of 5840 West Rowland Avenue, Littleton, Colorado, was advised of the identity of the interviewing Agent, and the nature and purpose of the interview. The interview was conducted in the presence of her Mother, Gail Reynolds, DOB 10/20/48. She provided the following information.

On 4/20/99, Lori arrived at Columbine High School at normal starting time in the morning, which is approximately 7:00am. She attended all her mornings classes prior to her lunch periods, the last being American Government, which ends at 11:10-11:15 am. She proceeded to the lunch room, and sat at a table she identified as table DD as per a diagram provided. She sat at this table with her usual group of friends who included:

1. Christen Cardwell ✓
2. David "BO" Lockwood ✓
3. Erin Hoffman ✓
4. Lauren Maestis ✓
5. Patrick Caruso ✓
6. Elizabeth Nolan ✓

She brought her lunch that day, and was sitting eating when she heard noise from the area of the outside stairs on the northwest corner of the cafeteria. She walked to the west windows of the cafeteria where she observed an individual dressed in black with a ski mask shooting a gun. She observed the shooter shoot one person outside and continue walking towards the cafeteria. As the shooter walked, the shooter fired randomly towards the cafeteria.

Mr. Sanders then ran in the cafeteria and yelled for everyone to get down. Lori along with Elizabeth Nolan, and David Lockwood laid down and crawled towards the stairs on the far side of the cafeteria. They then ran up the stairs and Mr. Andres Sr., had a large group of students stay in the auditorium. All during this time, shots could be heard from the general direction of the cafeteria. Mr. Andres wanted the students to stay in the auditorium, however the students all ran out, and in the direction of the front office. When they arrived in front of the office, they noticed what they thought was a bomb, so they ran

down the hallway which leads to the north and exited towards the west side of the school.

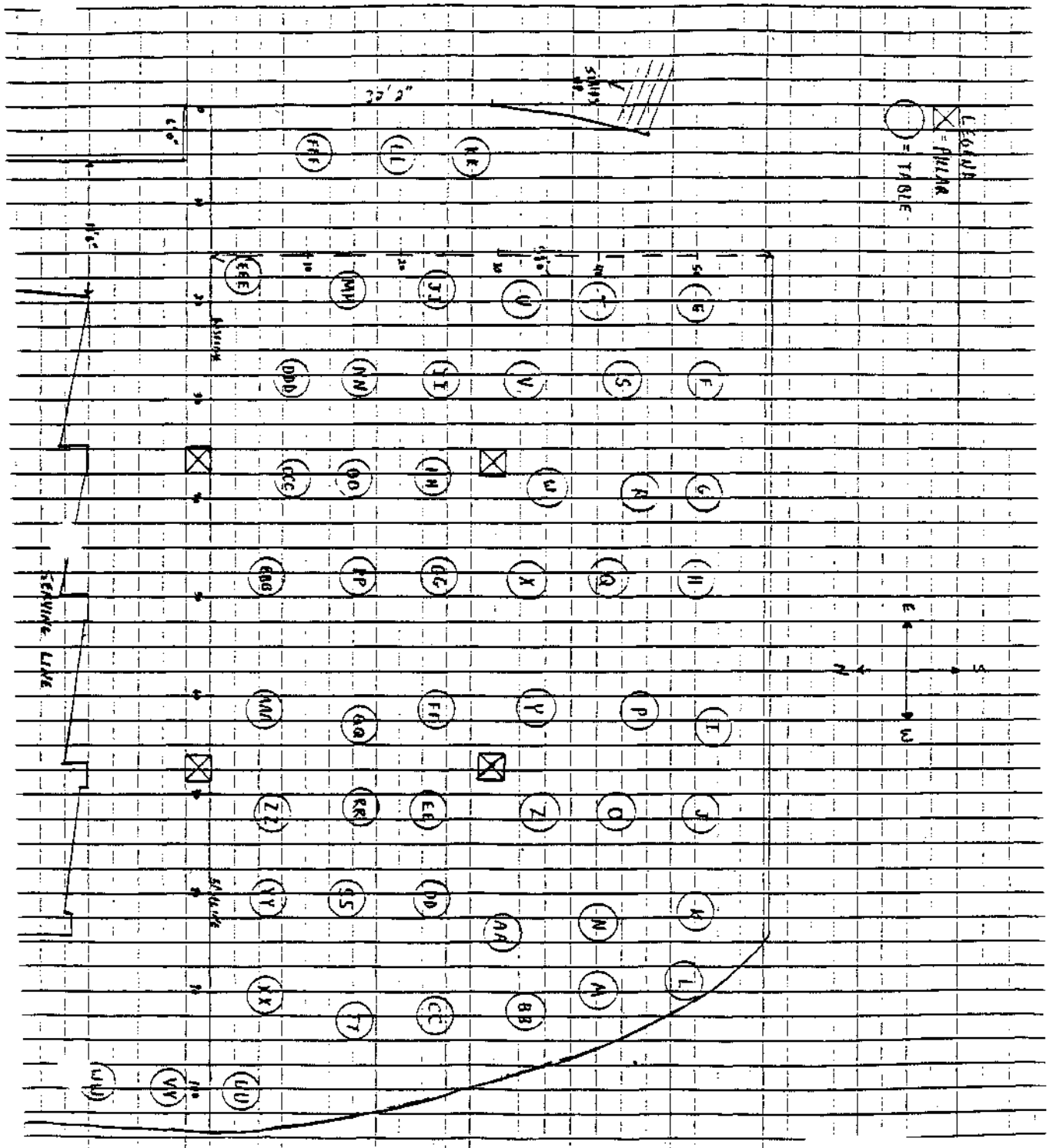
The same basic group of students continued on towards to the public library in Clement park. While standing outside the library, at approximately 12:30-1:00 pm, an unidentified individual walked by Lori and a friend of her's named Matt Lorenz. This individual openly laughed at them. This individual is described as male, 18-19 years of age, 5'10", thin (180lbs), light complexion, clean shaven, wearing black cargo type pants, white t-shirt, and red suspenders.

On 4/19/99, Lori saw Eric Harris just prior to lunch period in the hallway near the cafeteria, walking away from the cafeteria. Harris said nothing, and Lori did not exchange greetings with him. She did not usually exchange greetings with any Trench Coat Mafia (TCM) or anyone that she had heard was associated with the TCM. In December of 1998, just prior to Christmas break, while in her first hour choir class, she overheard something that a boy named Brooks Brown was telling some other boys in the class. Brown told a boy named Robbie Sherper that on 4/20, something bad would happen. She thought that Brooks Brown might hang out with the TCM.

Finally, Lori explained that at the school, in the morning, everyday they have a school news cast with general school information broadcast on T.V. monitors. The broadcast finishes with a thought for the day. On 4/20/99, the thought for the day was "you'll wish you hadn't came today".

Lori Reynolds was interviewed on 05-03-99 by Inv Jill Reuteler (7394), Colorado State Patrol, at approx 8 15am at her residence

I asked Ms Reynolds to go over the events of the day of the shooting. Ms Reynolds said that she had a lunch and that she usually got to lunch about 11 15am. She said that she had brought her own lunch and usually sat at a table near the windows with her friends. I asked her which friends she ate with that day and she said Elizabeth Nolan, Dannette Muselman, Jami Amo, David Lockwood (303-979-5999), Patrick Caruso, Lauren Maestas (unsure of spelling) and Erin Hoffman. Ms. Reynolds said that she had walked around (from the outdoors) to the table that she and her friends usually sat at in the cafeteria and that she had just sat down when she heard what sounded like a firecracker and Mr Sanders, a teacher, told everyone to get down and stay down. I asked Ms Reynolds if she saw anything unusual at lunch, any backpack or bag or anything like that, and she said no, but that a lot of the students had backpacks in the cafeteria.

Ms Reynolds said that while she was on the floor of the cafeteria she could see out the window and saw one of the gun men. Ms Reynolds described the clothing as all black, with a black mask, like a ski mask, with the eyes cut out, a black coat, black combat boots, black pants. Ms Reynolds said he was alone, but she could hear automatic weapon fire coming from upstairs. She said that she could hear single shot firing coming from the guy dressed in black. She said it looked like he had come from the direction of the baseball field and that it appeared that he was randomly shooting. Ms Reynolds stated, "I saw him shoot someone, outside of the cafeteria." I asked her where the gunman when he shot the person and she said that he was at the top of the stairs outside, and that she was about 100 feet away. She said that she did not know who the person was that he shot. She said that she didn't know who the gunman dressed in black was.

Ms Reynolds said that she and the other students crawled up the stairs, through the auditorium, and to the north hall by the front entrance and offices. She said that they did not go out the front door by the offices because it looked like a bomb had been thrown in by the front door and there was a lot of broken glass. She said that they went out the doors past the weights room and the foods room.

Ms Reynolds said that after she left the high school, she went around the soccer fields and by Clement Park. She said around 1 00 to 1 30pm, she saw a white male, with sandy blonde long hair, in a bull cut, wearing black pants, red suspenders and a white T shirt walking from the school, to the west across the lake. She said that he was by himself and that she could see that he was laughing. She said that she didn't hear him laughing and that she didn't think that he went to school at Columbine. She said that about the time that she saw this guy that she had seen Matt Lohrenz, student and football player, at the library and that he might have seen him too. Ms Reynolds said that her mom picked her up from the library around 2 00pm.

Ms. Reynolds said that last semester she had first hour choir and that Brooks Brown was in her class. She said that she overheard him (Brown) tell two other students that "something is gonna happen on 04-20". She said that he told this to Zach and Robbie Sherper or Sharper, who are both Juniors at Columbine. Ms. Reynolds said at the time she thought they were talking about drugs and that she thought that four twenty was a nickname for marijuana. Ms. Reynolds said that she didn't think anyone else heard this conversation.

I asked Ms. Reynolds if she had a backpack at school. She said that she did, it was in the cafeteria, near the windows, and described it as dark navy blue with a leather like bottom containing folders, assignments, prescription glasses, and calculator. She said she also had a purple Columbine Rebels wind breaker, by her backpack.

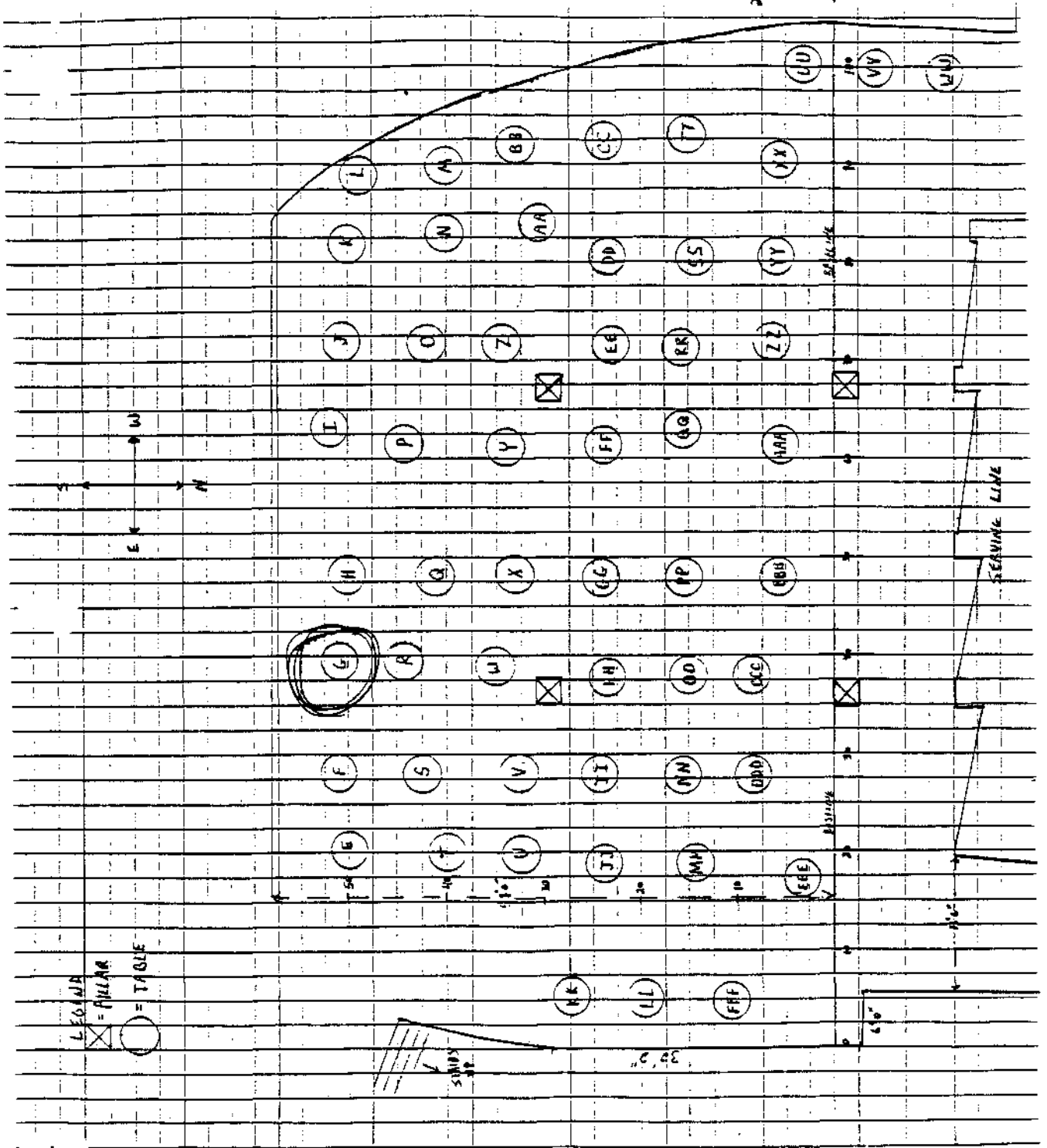

**INVESTIGATION:**

On 05-27-99, between the hours of 1308 and 1340, I had an opportunity to speak with Jean Richer in reference to the Columbine High School incident that occurred on 04-20-99.

Jean Richer told me he arrived at Columbine High School on 04-20-99, at about 0730 hours, telling me he rides the RTD bus every morning. Jean proceeded into school and entered school through the south doors, Rebel Corner, and into the commons area at the cafeteria. He told me he does not have a first hour class, and as usual, he'll sit down in the cafeteria and talk with friends. On that particular morning, he was in the cafeteria with his ex-girlfriend, Tiffany Spevak, and they sat in there for about an hour.

Jean was asked if he observed anything out of the ordinary, possibly out in the Junior or Senior parking lot, prior to him entering into the commons area of the cafeteria. He told me he did observe Spevak out in the Senior parking lot, and that she was talking with Nate Dykeman, but he had no additional information reference their conversation. I asked Jean that once he got into the cafeteria at the school, if he observed two large duffle bags or sports bags, one being blue in color and the other an organish/red in color, or if he observed anyone carry those into the cafeteria and place them on the floor. He told me did not observe the bags, and that he did not see anyone bring the bags in. Jean proceeded to tell me at around 0820 hours, he went to his second hour Government Economics class, and after being released from that class, he went to his third period Physics class taught by Mr. Manuello, and that his fourth period class is Math taught by Ms. McMullen. After being released from his Math class, he told me he proceeded down to the cafeteria area for his lunch period. He told me he arrived at about 1113 hours, at which time I showed him a map of the cafeteria and asked him to tell me if he recalls where he sat. He told me he sat at table "AAA," and
