Brittany Weeden, DOB 05/28/1984, 5628 West Alder Way, Littleton, Colorado, telephone (303)979-1269, a student at Columbine High School, was interviewed at her home in the presence of her mother, Kay Weeden, by Special Agent (SA) Ricky V. Wright regarding the incident that took place on 04/20/1999 at Columbine High School. After being advised as to the identity of the interviewing agent and the nature of the interview, Weeden provided the following information:

On the day of the shooting, Weeden was in the cafeteria during all of fourth period and during lunch, beginning at approximately 10:20 am. Weeden was sitting at the cafeteria table marked L on the diagram sketch during fourth period and lunch. Weeden estimates that there were 50 students in the cafeteria during fourth period. Weeden recalls that Stephanie Martin was sitting with her fourth period, but did not stay for lunch. Chris Lucas and Katie Place were also in the cafeteria fourth period, but were sitting by the stairs. Candyce Therrien, Brittany Tyacke, Katie Place, Sarah Gillings, Stephanie Duffy, Chris Lucas, Mary Campbell, Kenny Last Name Unknown (LNU) and Jennifer Camacho were sitting at or near table L with Weeden during lunch. Weeden was sitting facing southeast. Jennifer Camacho was sitting to Weeden's left and Mary Campbell was sitting to Weeden's right.

Weeden first noticed that something was wrong, when students started getting under the tables. Weeden looked out the west cafeteria windows and briefly saw one person in a black trenchcoat going up the stairs just northwest of the cafeteria. The individual had a rifle in his left hand and it was pointed at the ground. Weeden thinks the individual was wearing a hat or cap. Weeden could not see his pants. Weeden only saw the individual from behind and could not describe him further. Weeden then got down under her table and did not see anything else that was going on outside the cafeteria. Weeden could hear shots outside and most of the students in the cafeteria started running. Weeden stayed under her table and could see that some of the students that ran up the stairs were turning around and trying to come back down to the cafeteria. Weeden thought that there was shooting going on upstairs as well. Most of the students that came back down the stairs, then ran out the student

entrance by Rebel Corner. Weeden, Mary Campbell, and Kenny LNU, were the only ones from Weeden's table that stayed in the cafeteria. Weeden thinks that there were at least five other students that stayed in the cafeteria as well.

While Weeden was under the table, some of the janitors were running around and trying to go up the stairs but someone was shooting at them from the top of the stairs. Weeden recalls that someone threw something down the stairs that exploded and caused a light to break. After a while, two gunmen came down the stairs. One of the gunmen was wearing a white shirt, blue pants, and a vest, which held some of his gear. He also was carrying a rifle. The other gunman was wearing a black trenchcoat, black baseball cap, and had a smaller pistol-like gun. Weeden thinks the one in the black trenchcoat was the same gunman she saw on the stairs outside the cafeteria. Weeden could not describe the gunmen or their weapons any further. When they came down the stairs, the one in the white shirt stayed on the stairs while the one in the black trenchcoat walked to the northeast corner of the cafeteria and started shooting at the tables and chairs in the middle of the cafeteria. Weeden heard the gunman on the stairs tell the gunman in the black trenchcoat to shoot from the northeast corner of the cafeteria and then told him to come back and shoot from the southeast corner. After the gunman in the black trenchcoat finished shooting, the gunman in the white shirt came down from the stairs, stood in the middle of the east end of the cafeteria, and started shooting at the middle of the cafeteria as well. Weeden does not know how many shots they fired. About this time a large fire suddenly erupted in the middle of the cafeteria near the west pillar. Weeden does not know where the fire came from or what cause the fire. Weeden does not recall the fire being accompanied with any explosion.

When the fire started, all of the remaining students in the cafeteria suddenly jumped up and ran out the south doors of the cafeteria. Weeden was the last one out and heard one of the gunmen yell as she was going out the door. Weeden paused and looked back. She saw the gunman in the black trenchcoat standing in the southeast corner of the cafeteria, but could not see the other gunman. She heard one of them yell again and she turned and ran out of the cafeteria. Weeden does not know what was yelled and does not know if they were yelling at her or if they were looking at her. Weeden and the other students ran out

to the senior parking lot, where a police officer told them to get down behind the cars. The police eventually let them go to the soccer field.

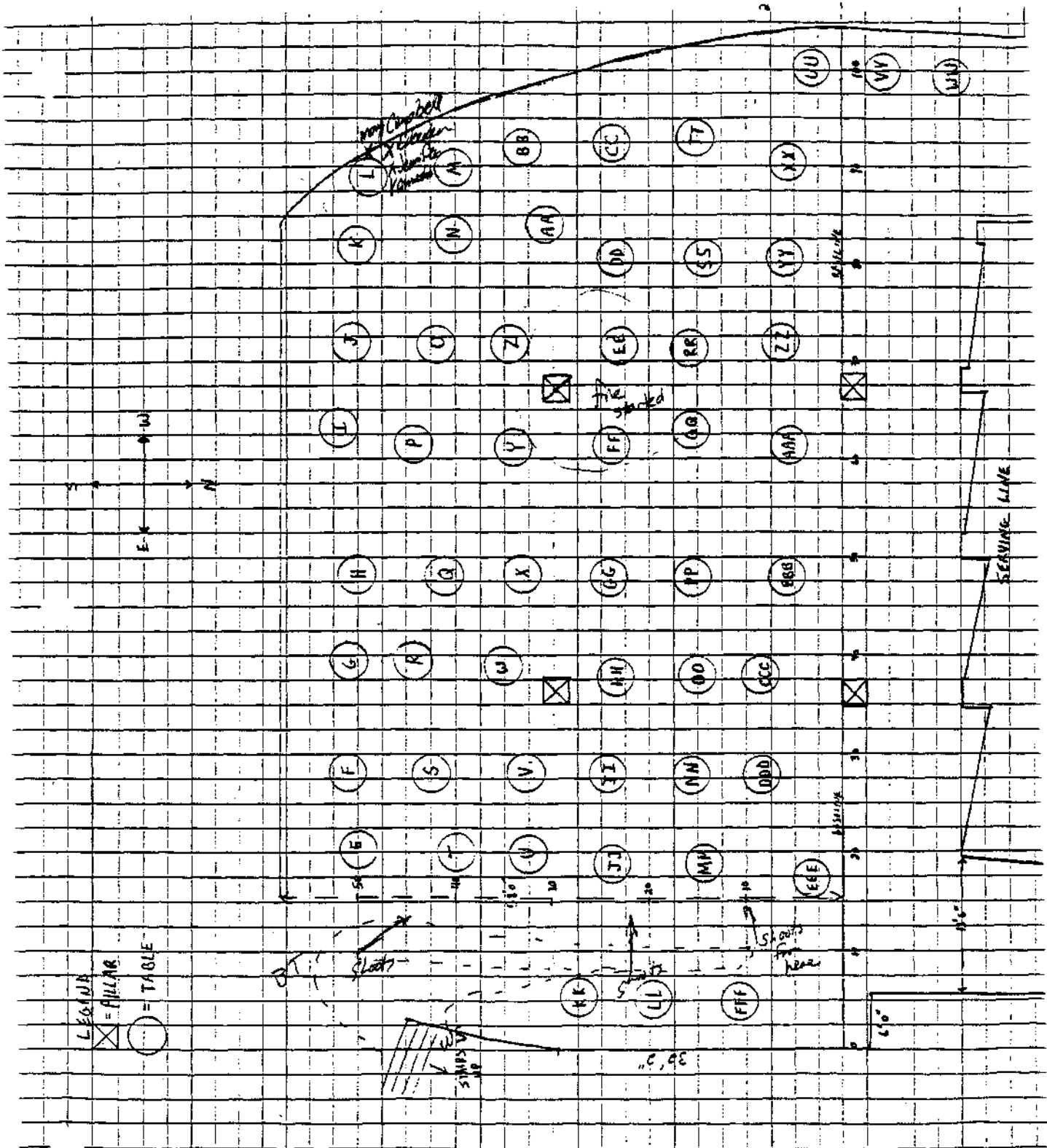
Weeden does not remember seeing any large duffle bags in the cafeteria or anyone carrying any large duffle bags during fourth period or during lunch. Weeden does not recall seeing anyone wearing a trenchcoat in the cafeteria during fourth period or during lunch. Weeden was not in the cafeteria at any other time that day. Weeden did not know Eric Harris, Dylan Klebold, or any of their associates. Weeden does not have an Internet screen name.

On the day of the shooting, Weeden was wearing a white sleeveless flower dress and brown sandals.

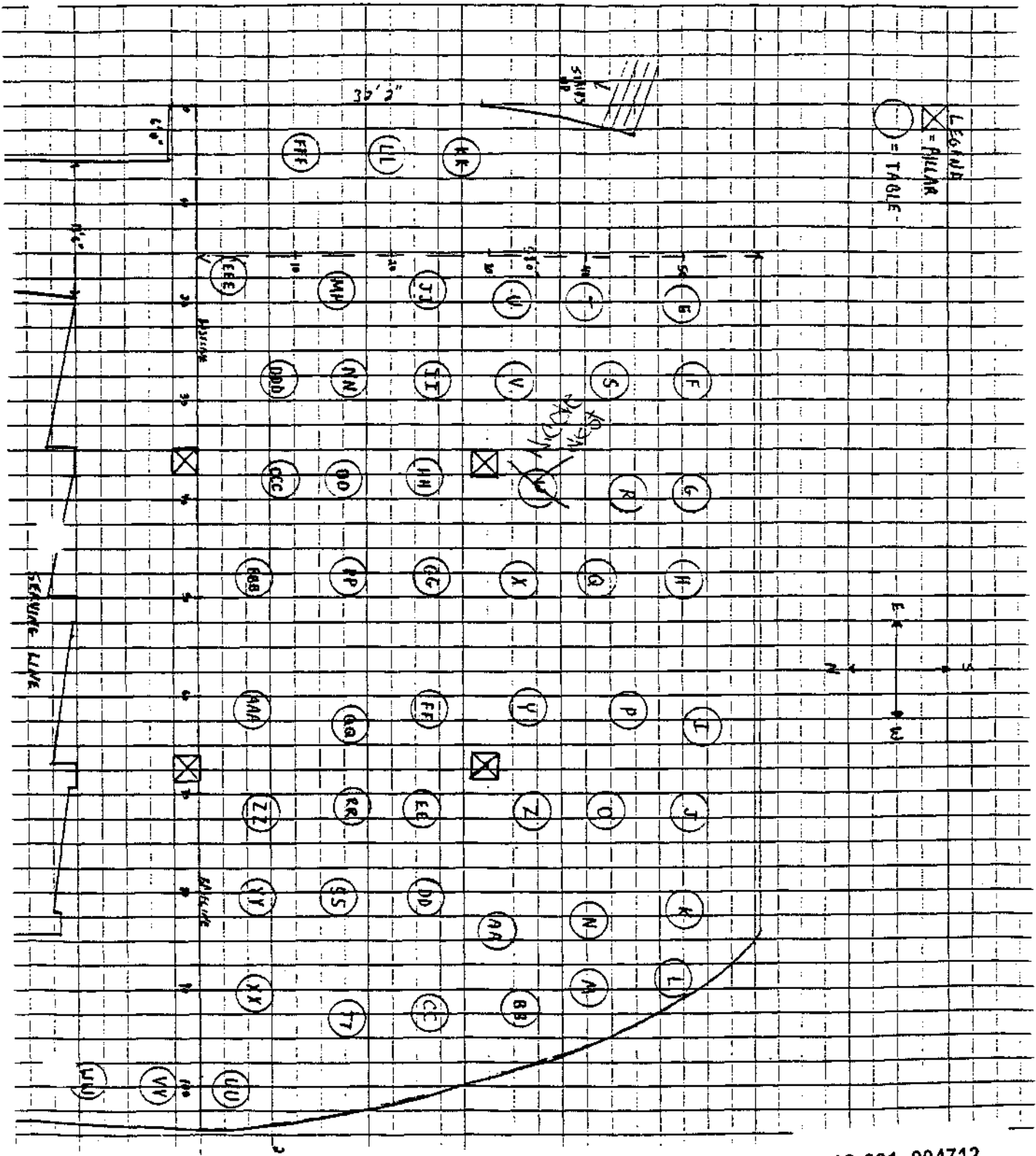

INVESTIGATION:

On 5-3-99 between the hours of 0923 and 1015 I had an opportunity to speak with Heather Whaling in reference to the incident that occurred at Columbine High School on 4-20-99.

Heather stated on 4-20-99 she arrived at Columbine High School between 0715 and 0720 hours, and upon her arrival she went to the student store located in the "Rebel Corner" near the cafeteria. Heather stated she stayed there for about five minutes and continued on to her scheduled classes. Heather was asked if she saw two large duffel bags or sports bags, one being blue and the other an organish-red located in the central area of the cafeteria. She stated she did not observe those items. Heather advised that she continued on with her daily schedule, and after being released from her fourth hour French class, taught by Miss Argnier around 1110 hours she immediately went to the cafeteria area and arrived at about 1111 hours. Heather was shown a map of the cafeteria area and was asked if she could tell me where she was seated. She stated she believed she was

seated at table "h" or "g" and seated at the table with her were Jessica Arzola, 303-932-7471, Ben Schuman, unknown phone, Matt Bruce, unknown phone, and Amber, last name and telephone unknown. Heather stated these were members of her church group. After arriving at the cafeteria, Heather stated she placed her backpack on her chair, and went to the food-service line to get her lunch. I asked Heather if she saw the two above-described bags and again she told me she didn't.

Heather stated that shortly after she returned to her table she remembers seeing a janitor running near the south doors of the cafeteria, at which time she heard a loud bang. Shortly after that she heard an unidentified teacher yelling at the students to get down. After a short period of time the students that were near the west windows of the cafeteria started to run east, at which time she proceeded to run east with the remainder of the students, up the stairs to the second level.

Heather stated that once she reached the second level she ran east down the Math/Science hallway, exited the school and went to Leawood Park, where she remained. Heather was asked if she saw any gunmen while she was in the school or after she exited the school and she stated she did not see any gunmen.

Heather was asked if she knew any members of the Trench Coat Mafia, specifically, Eric Harris or Dylan Klebold. She stated she did not know who those individuals were and she did not know much about the group.

Heather was asked if she left any other property inside Columbine High School. She stated the only thing she left was her black Jansport backpack in the cafeteria, which contained several school books and personal items.

Heather was asked if she had heard any rumors reference the date 4-20-99. She stated she did hear that it was a smoker's holiday or a marijuana smoker's holiday.

Heather could provide no additional information. At the completion of this interview I had Heather diagram where she was seated in the cafeteria and her movement out of the area. A copy of that diagram is attached to this report.

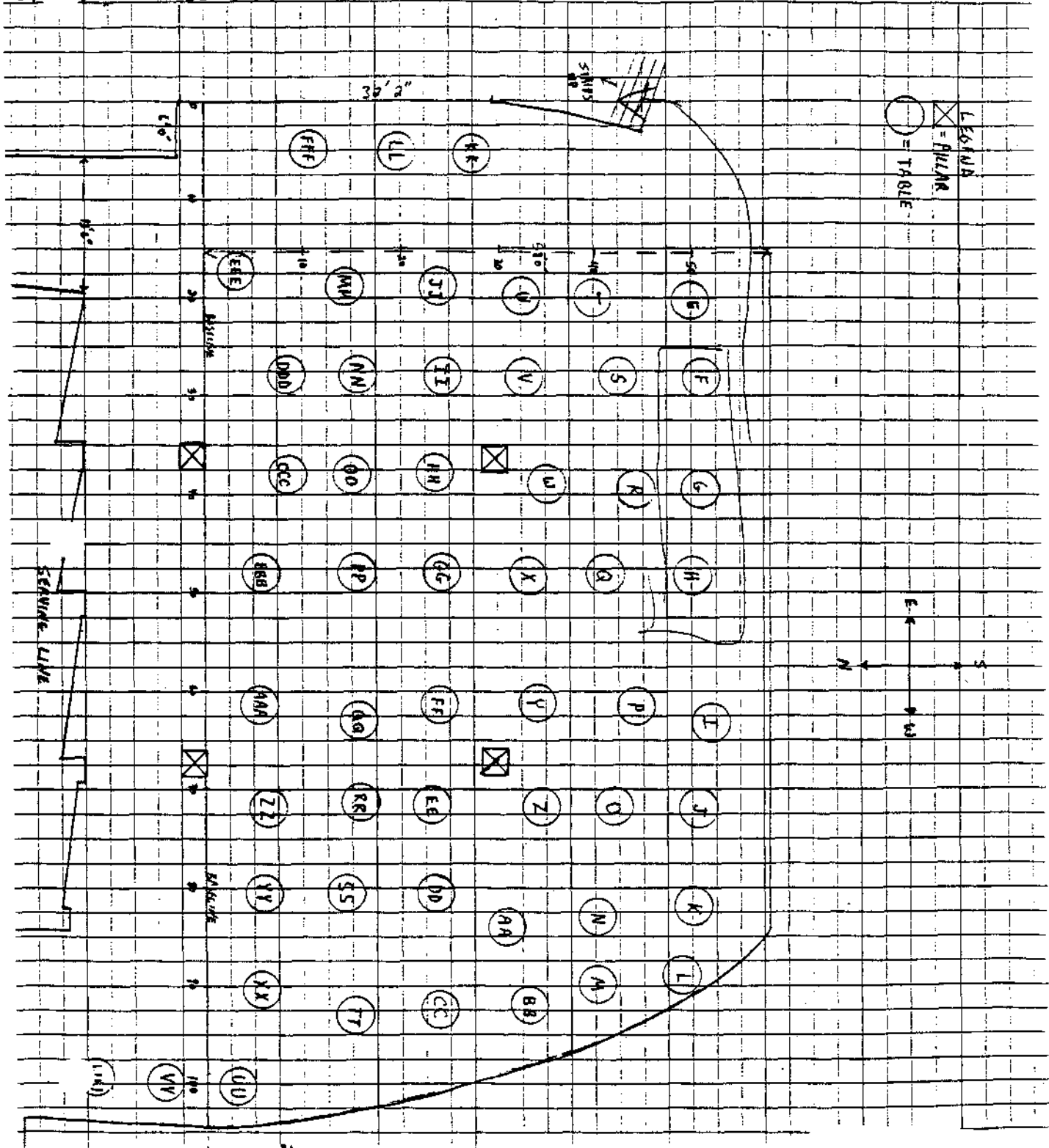

Caitlin Jean Whitney, DOB 05/31/1982, 8051 South Upham Street, Littleton, Colorado, telephone (303)933-0544, a junior at Columbine High School, was interviewed at her home in the presence of her parents, Dennis and Mary Weeden, by Special Agent (SA) Ricky V. Wright regarding the incident that took place on 04/20/1999 at Columbine High School. After being advised as to the identity of the interviewing agent and the nature of the interview, Whitney provided the following information:

At approximately 11:10 am, on the day of the shooting, Whitney got out of chemistry class, taught by Ms. Miller, and went from the science area to her locker located in the north main hall by the hall to the gymnasium. Whitney then went to the cafeteria by going west down the north main hall, south by the library, and down the stairs to the cafeteria. Whitney then sat down at one of the chairs near the food cart, which is located next to Rebel Corner. Whitney recalls that Samantha Haviland, Stefania Ubowski, Lindsie Macy, and Alan Barker were also there. Annie Carroccia may also have been there that day.

Whitney sat down for approximately three minutes, then got up and went out the student entrance to her car located in the junior parking lot to get some money. Whitney estimates that it took about five minutes to go to her car and get the money and come back. Whitney did not remember seeing Eric Harris, Dylan Klebold, or anything else suspicious when she went to her car. When Whitney was returning, she saw Lindsie Macy leaving to go to her car. Whitney had been sitting back down for approximately one minute, when some girls ran in the cafeteria from the south doors and were yelling that someone had a gun. Whitney and the rest of her friends got down and hid behind the food cart. There were some janitors in the cafeteria, who were running around telling everyone to get down. Mr. Sanders was also running around near the stairs.

Whitney then heard shots outside, which caused everyone to get up and start running. Whitney and some of her friends ran through the door on the south side of the auditorium. Alan Barker ran out the student entrance to find Lindsie Macy. Whitney and her friends knelt down in the auditorium for a few minutes by the sound booth. While Whitney was in the auditorium,

the fire alarm started going off and she could hear explosions and gunshots as well. Whitney left the auditorium by running out the northeast corner of the auditorium and into the north main hall. Whitney has heard that Brian Stepp was on the soccer field at the time of the shooting and saw the gunmen. She has also heard that James Medaugh was outside by Sean Graves, Lance Kirklin, and Dan Rohrbough at the time of the shooting. Whitney is aware that Sam Granillo and Sarah Slater were in the cafeteria during lunch and may have moved a large duffle bag off of the table where they were sitting.

On the day of the shooting, Whitney was wearing a blue button-up shirt, jean shorts, and white platform athletic shoes.

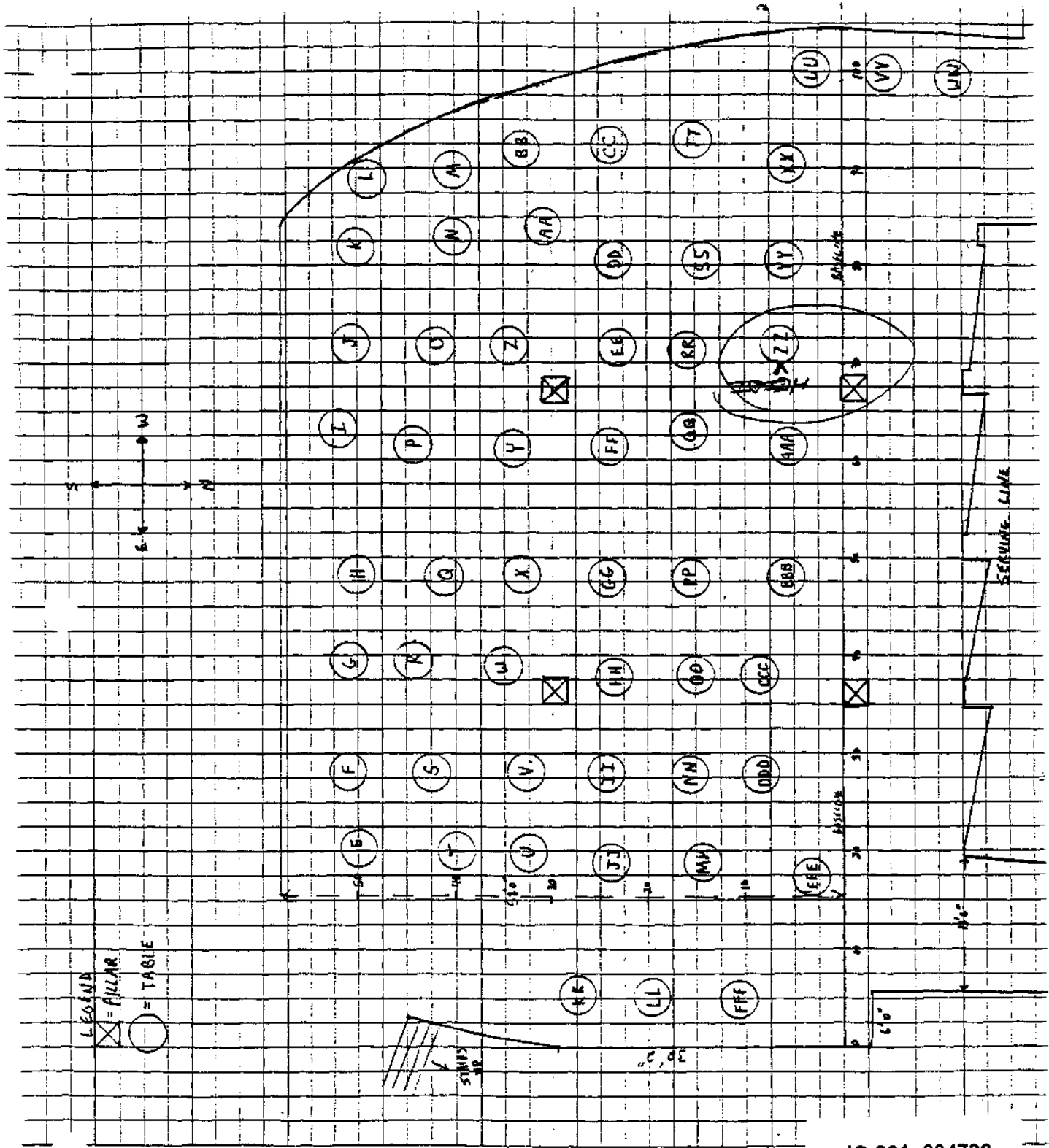

On 05/07/99, I responded to 5183 South Holland Street and met with Matthew Wilson and his mother Francis Wilson. Matthew confirmed he was in the cafeteria when the incident occurred.

Matthew said that on 04/20/99, he was driven to school by his friend Pat Cane. They parked in the Clement Park parking lot and walked to the school, entering through the main entrance. Matthew said he went to his locker, which is on the main level, and then went to the math hall. From the math hall, he went in the library. He estimated that he arrived at the library at approximately 7:15. He said he then went to his first hour science class, which is on the main level. After his first hour class, he went to his locker, and then to his second hour class, which is in the art room. This class is taught by Ms. Warrenkey. He then went to his third hour class in the foreign language wing, which is Spanish, and then from the foreign language wing he went to his fourth hour math class taught by Mr. Higgins. After his fourth hour class, Matthew said he went to his locker and then went outside of the building to get to the lower level cafeteria to avoid the crowds in the hallways. He estimated he traveled outside of the building and entered into the west door of the cafeteria

by the faculty lounge at approximately 11:15. He said during his travels outside of the building, he does not recall seeing anything unusual or suspicious.

Matthew said when he arrived at his usual table, which is WW, his friends were already there. He identified them as Sean Nossaman, Jeremy Mullen, Mike Kish, Mark Radke, and Tanya Warlock. He said he was sitting down doing his homework since he has the A lunch and the B lunch free, he wasn't going to eat until later. He said at approximately 11:20 to 11:25, students started to rush toward the west windows. Matthew said this activity usually indicates to him that there is a fight or something going on, and he wasn't real interested, so he didn't go to the window. He started to look in that direction, and then looked back toward the doorway since he had his back to it, and he saw someone come in the door shaking and yelling, "Get this off of me." He thought this student was Sean Graves. He said he then heard someone yelling to get down, and he got down, and went up against the wall by the windows. Matthew said as he looked around the cafeteria, he could tell something was going on outside and people were starting to run in the cafeteria and frantically trying to get to the stairs. He said he saw his friend Sean Nossaman run into the teacher's lounge, and he got up and ran into the kitchen area and into a storage room. Matthew said when he arrived in the storage room, another student, Matt Green, was already on the phone. There were several lunch ladies in the room with them. He said he could hear a lot of commotion and what he thought were popping noises coming from the cafeteria area. He thought perhaps these could be gunshots, and they were in repetition. Matthew said in the storage room there were 16 students and two lunch ladies.

Matthew said at the direction of the other students, they began to barricade the doors and huddle down. He said they could hear loud bombs going off every 5 to 10 minutes. He said at one point while they were in the room, someone jiggled the door handle. He later found out or thought it was perhaps Jeremy Mullen trying to get into the room. He said they used CO2 canisters and boxes to barricade the door, and that they had been told to write down their names and phone numbers. He said they could hear people moving outside of the room, but he could not tell if they were the suspects or other students trying to hide. They could also hear noises from above them. Matthew said they stopped hearing the blasting sounds and gunshots approximately 40 minutes after he arrived in the storage room. He said they received instructions that they may hear more gunshots as the SWAT teams entered because they may be using gunfire to clear the area. He said at approximately 1:30, SWAT personnel were in the building and they were waiting to evacuate them. Matthew thought it was a Jeffco SWAT Team who evacuated them. They were broken into groups of six at a time and were taken out through the kitchen into the teacher's lounge and then out through a window. They then ran up a hill by a fire truck where they were patted down and then transported to another location where they could use a telephone. his father picked him up at approximately 3 p.m. Matthew said he never saw the suspects, but the conversation inside the storage room indicated that Dylan Klebold might be involved.




Matthew said he was aware of the trench coat mafia but did not know much about the group. He knew they usually wore trench coats and their ball caps backwards. Wise. Stephanie confirmed that she had been in the cafeteria at the time the incident began, and that she had left her backpack in the cafeteria. Wise recalled that her father had driven her to school on 4/20/99 and that she arrived at school between 7:15 and 7:20am. She entered the school through the main doors by the front office on the east side. She said that she met with a group of her friends near the front entry way. Then she went to her first hour class which is Spanish. She said that she traveled to her Spanish class down the stairwell through the commons and into the regular classrooms. She said that she traveled to this class with her friend, Jennifer Christiansen. She said that her second hour class is computer in the lower level and that she then went, between second and third hour, to her locker and then to her Science class which is upstairs in the Science wing. She then went to her fourth hour class which is language, and then to the "A" lunch. She said that she had gone, just prior to the "A" lunch, to the financial office near the main entrance to purchase her parking pass. She then went to her locker to get her lunch and estimated that she arrived in the commons at approximately 11:10 to 11:15am. She said that when she arrived, she came down the stairs and went to the pop machines and then to her table. She said that when she arrived there were already people seated at the table. She identified them as Carmie Deihl, Megan Schoenbien, and Jean Martin. She thought that she was sitting at table "Z". She said that she started eating and then she saw that people were running to the west window. She said that Mr. Sanders then entered the commons, and she thought that he was running along the south wall, yelling for people to *get on the floor*. She said that she was looking out the windows at about this time, and saw between two cars that were parked just west of the cafeteria, smoke coming from between them. She said that she then started to crawl towards the stairwell. She said that she was with her friend, Carmie, and that as they got approximately half way to the stairwell, they got up and ran. that the teachers barricaded the doors with tables and cabinets, and armed themselves with fire extinguishers and metal rods. She said that one of the teachers was on the phone in the Science room where Mr. Sanders was being attended to by other teachers and students.

Wise thinks that while she was in the storage room she could hear gunmen walking in the east and south corridor around the room where she was. She said that everything then got quiet and the fire alarm went off, and the bells started to ring. They thought that this might be an indication that SWAT teams were coming to evacuate them. She said that eventually a SWAT team did come in to evacuate them. They took them out the door by the closet. They were moved down a hallway where they were searched and then evacuated out through the east doors. She stated that while they were in the Science storage room, the teachers had removed the lighting to make the room darker so that the suspects could not see into the room. Wise did not see any of the suspects.

Wise describes her backpack as a blue Eddie Bauer, containing her history book, her math book, her binders, which are black and gray in color, her identification, her Texas Instruments 83 Graphing calculator, keys, and medication. Wise said she was wearing khaki cargo shorts, dark green top and sandals.

Wise said that prior to the incident, she had heard of the trench coat mafia. She said she was aware of them since her Sophomore year. She said that only information she knew about the trench coat mafia was that they wore trench coats and that they smoked "pot" cigarettes on the corner of Polk Street and South Pierce. She said that she had since heard that student Chris Reilly is the person who puts together the thought of the day, and that Eric and Dylan were not in class that particular morning. She thought that she had heard that the thought of the day really had nothing to do with what occurred but just a reference to being smoker's day out of school.

Wise says that she does have Internet access but does not have an ICQ account. She does not know anyone with a double pierced eyebrow, that she didn't see anything suspicious as far as duffle bags or backpacks.

Wise also said that she had heard since she'd been back at school, that several students that were sitting at table "HH", Katie Patrick, Keith Nacaroud, and Joe Camius, thought that they may have had a duffle bag under their table, but she'd heard nothing further about that.

She said that she was dropped off at the main entrance that she was by herself and that she went downstairs to the cafeteria and met with friends, Carri Preziosi, Steve Broden, Jeremy Orban, and Chris (last name unknown). She said that they met on the north end of the cafeteria at one of the tables by the stairs and spent some time together before first hour. She said that first hour begins at 0720 hours and that shortly before that she left the cafeteria and walked Carri Preziosi upstairs and then went to her first hour English class. She said that normally she sees people from the group, the "trench coat mafia" sitting at the south end of the cafeteria by the doors. She said that they usually wear black coats and they listen to "devil music". They play, "Nazi games", card games where they chant German lyrics. They also listen to German music in the morning, but she said that she has never had any problems with the trench coat mafia.

Brandi Wiseman said that she recalled that several of the group of the "trench coat mafia" were sitting at their usual table by the south side of the cafeteria, however ERIC HARRIS was not with them. She would have

recognized him since she has seen the photos of him.

After first hour English Brandi Wiseman went to second hour science class in the science department. After that she proceeded to her third hour, which she has off. She again proceeded to the cafeteria where she met with a friend, Amanda Arpacalis. She said that the cafeteria was approximately half full at the time and she didn't notice anything unusual. She then left the cafeteria and went to her fourth hour class with a friend, Shannon Ryan. She said that she left her Spanish class to go to the "A" lunch and arrived there at approximately 1110 hours with her friend Shannon Ryan. She said they went to a table near the serving line by coming down the hall, going past the east exit doors and then cutting through the tables where there was a clear path. They got a table by the pillar. Brandi Wiseman said that she didn't have enough money to buy lunch and just wanted to get some candy from the vending machines, which are located near the exit by the faculty lounge. She said that she and a friend, Lindsey Wyant, went to the candy machines, and when they got near the machines they stopped at a table to talk to some friends, Jeremy Mullen and Michael Kish. She said that while they at the table, they thought what they heard was fight outside and they thought they could hear somebody hit the ground. They then went to the door to look out the door and they saw a boy screaming that he had been shot. Brandi Wiseman said that she went to the door and could see the boy, who had been yelling that he had been shot and thought he was paralyzed. She said she did not go out the door but then heard what she thought were gunshots. She ran back from the door and a lunch lady went to check on the boy. She said that someone began yelling, "get down" and she crawled from where she was near the entrance door into the kitchen. Her friend Lindsey crawled with her. She said that as they crawled they could hear more gunshots.

The lunch lady then followed them into the kitchen and directed them to a rear storage room in the kitchen. She said that when she got to the storage room, there were about fifteen other people that went into the room with her and they shut the door. One other person she knew as Matt Depew got on the phone and called the police. She said that Matt Depew was speaking Officer Leitz. She did not know from what police department he was with. She said that Matt Depew told the officer about the two gunman and what was going on in the storage room.

Brandi Wiseman said that the room was extremely crowded and that people were sitting on top of each other. She said that they all crouched to the ground and she could identify some of the people in the room as Richie Green, Danny Lab, James Stewart, Sean Ryan, Tasha Olsen, Tonya Warlock, and Matt Depew. She estimated with herself and her friend Lindsey, there were 17 total people in the room. She said that several boys

were crouching on top of them in case the shooters came into the room or started shooting through the doors. She said that she could hear gunshots and screaming throughout their time in the room. She said that the gunshots and screaming and bombs came from not only the cafeteria but from the library above her. She said that after the commotion occurred in the library they could hear what she thought were people hitting the floor or bookshelves being knocked over along with gunshots and screaming. She said after the commotion in the library there were more gunshots downstairs. She estimated that approximately one hour after they went into the room Matt was told by the police to barricade the door. They took several CO2 tanks and cases of frosting and placed them in front of the door. She said approximately ten minutes later, someone came to the door and said he was Jeremy. She thought it was Jeremy Mullen. He asked them to open the door and told them he was going to help them, but they did not open the door because they were afraid it might be the gunmen. She said that people were all crying and most of them were going to pass out from the heat. They were holding on to each other, hugging each other and praying. In a short time after Jeremy Mullen left, there were knocks at the door. She knew it was the gunmen in front of the door. She said that they could hear the gunmen reloading their shotguns and other guns in front of the door and then begin shooting at what she thought were the appliances in the kitchen. She said that she could hear two distinct voices yelling at each other, however, she couldn't discern what they were saying. She said that she had her watch on and that this occurred at approximately 1230 hours. She said that they continued to pray and hold hands and again they could hear what they thought were the suspects in front of the door. She said that everyone began crying and others were asking them to be quiet. She said that shortly after that they could hear more shooting upstairs. She said that they then got information from the officer on the phone that the police were in the building. They hear more gunshots and what she thought were firecrackers. She said that they had been told that the SWAT team would be coming into the cafeteria area and that they would be using some type of explosive that would sound like a firecracker and gunshots to clear the building to make sure the suspects weren't in there. She said they first heard them in the faculty lounge and then they could hear people knocking on doors. She said that someone knocked on their door and said they were with SWAT team. They initially refused to open the door and the SWAT team insisted again. They finally opened the door and found it was in fact the SWAT team. The SWAT team said that they would escort them out of the building, told them to stay down and shut the door. She said that they then heard what she thought was the SWAT team exchanging gunfire with the suspects and a yelling at them to get down. Approximately fifteen minutes later the SWAT team

came back and told everyone to stand up. They told them girls first and then they took them from the kitchen through a door in the faculty lounge along a wall in the lounge where a window had been broken out. She said that there was a police officer who was kneeling on the ground below the window and that they were instructed to step on his back and climb out the window. They walked the students along the school and then across the soccer field. They told them to stay there.

Brandi Wiseman said that she had a black Eastport backpack. That the backpack contained her binders, her math folder, her keys, chapstick, some money, and her calculator which is a TI-83. She said it was left on the table.

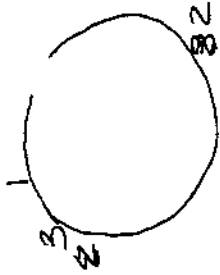
Brandi Wiseman said that she was wearing blue shorts, white tank top with blue flowers, white tennis shoes,

Brandi Wiseman said she did not noticed any duffle bags or unusual backpacks in the cafeteria but added that it would not be unusual for people to leave such items behind as they dropped these things off prior to getting in the lunch line. She said that she did not see ERIC HARRIS or DYLAN KLEBOLD on either Monday or Tuesday. She had seen "trench coat mafia" members but had no conversation with them and no incidences. Brandi Wiseman said that she has not heard from anyone else, or other people, about any suspects talking about bomb making or gun buying.

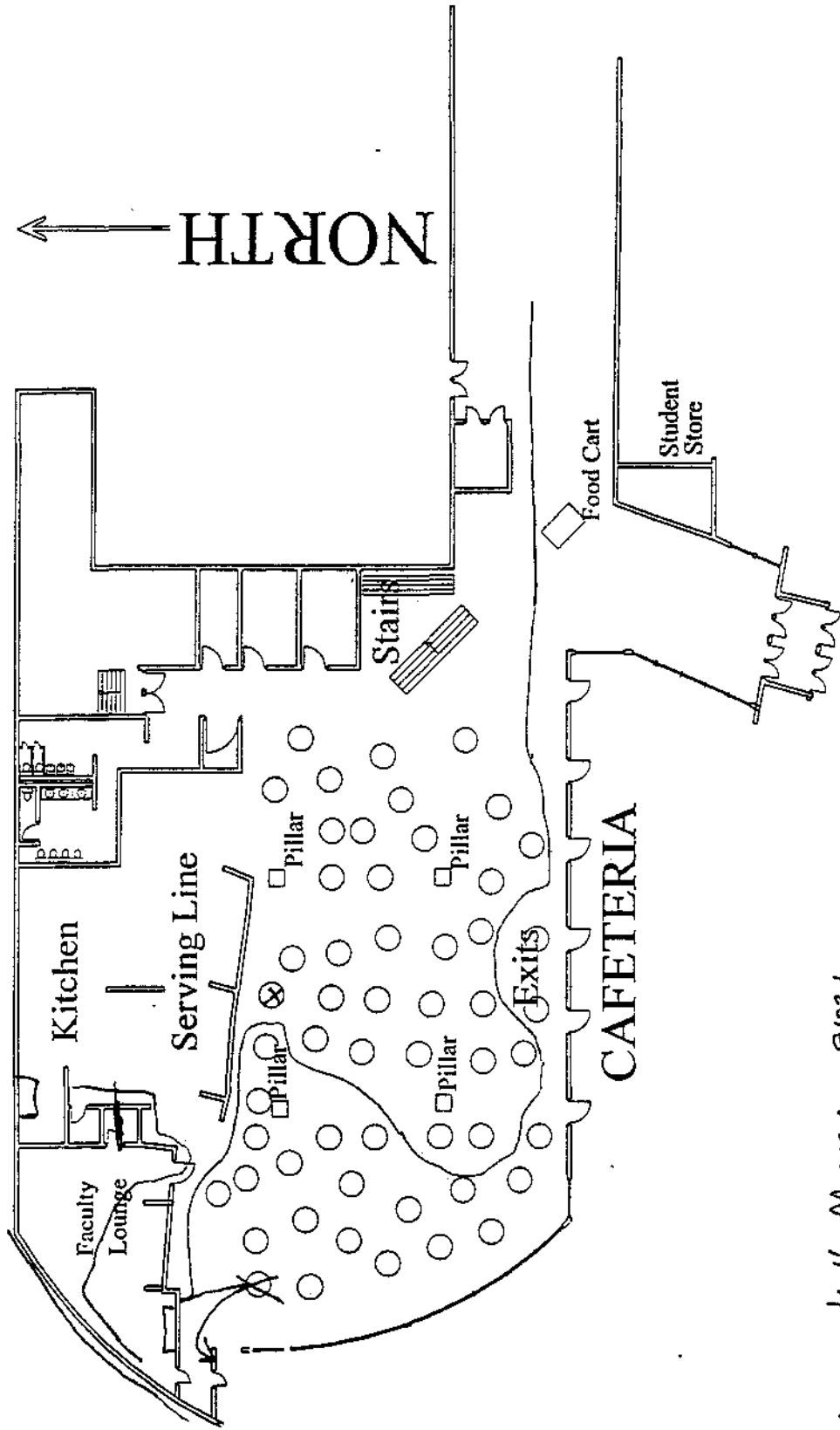
The only other information Brandi could provide on the "trench coat mafia" was that they all wore the black trench coats and that last year, she believed in December, there was a football player, whose name she didn't know, that was being threatened by the "trench coat mafia". She said that another football player apparently threw this "trench coat mafia" member against a locker and the "trench coat mafia" member punched the student in the face. She said that she thought that the "trench coat mafia" member got suspended for the incident. She could provide no names other than the incident occurred in December of 1998. Brandi Wiseman also drew on a map of the cafeteria of where she came from to enter the cafeteria, what table she believes she was at, and where she exited the building. She believed that she was perhaps at table "RR" although she could not be positive.

On 05-07-99, at about 8:30 a.m., I spoke with CHS student Brandi Wiseman as follow up on DN2462. The interview was conducted by telephone. Although Brandi Wiseman was previously interviewed (DN1015), the purpose of this follow up was to determine whether or not Brandi had seen or could identify Eric Harris, Dylan Klebold, or any of the individuals known to associate with them.

Brandi confirmed that she had been inside the cafeteria on 04-20-99 at about 11:20 a.m. Brandi said that a group of students had gathered near the door located at the northwest corner of the cafeteria. Brandi said that she approached the west windows, near the door, and saw a student lying on the ground. Brandi said that people started yelling to 'get down,' and that she ducked underneath one of the tables (VV or WW). From there, Brandi said that she crawled toward the kitchen area, near the faculty lounge. While there, Brandi said that she looked back toward the west windows and saw an individual, outside, wearing a black trench coat, who appeared to be running south toward the southwest corner of the cafeteria. Brandi said that the glimpse she caught of this individual was very brief, and that she did not see his face or any weapon. Brandi said that other than the black trench coat, she did not notice any other clothing or features on this individual.

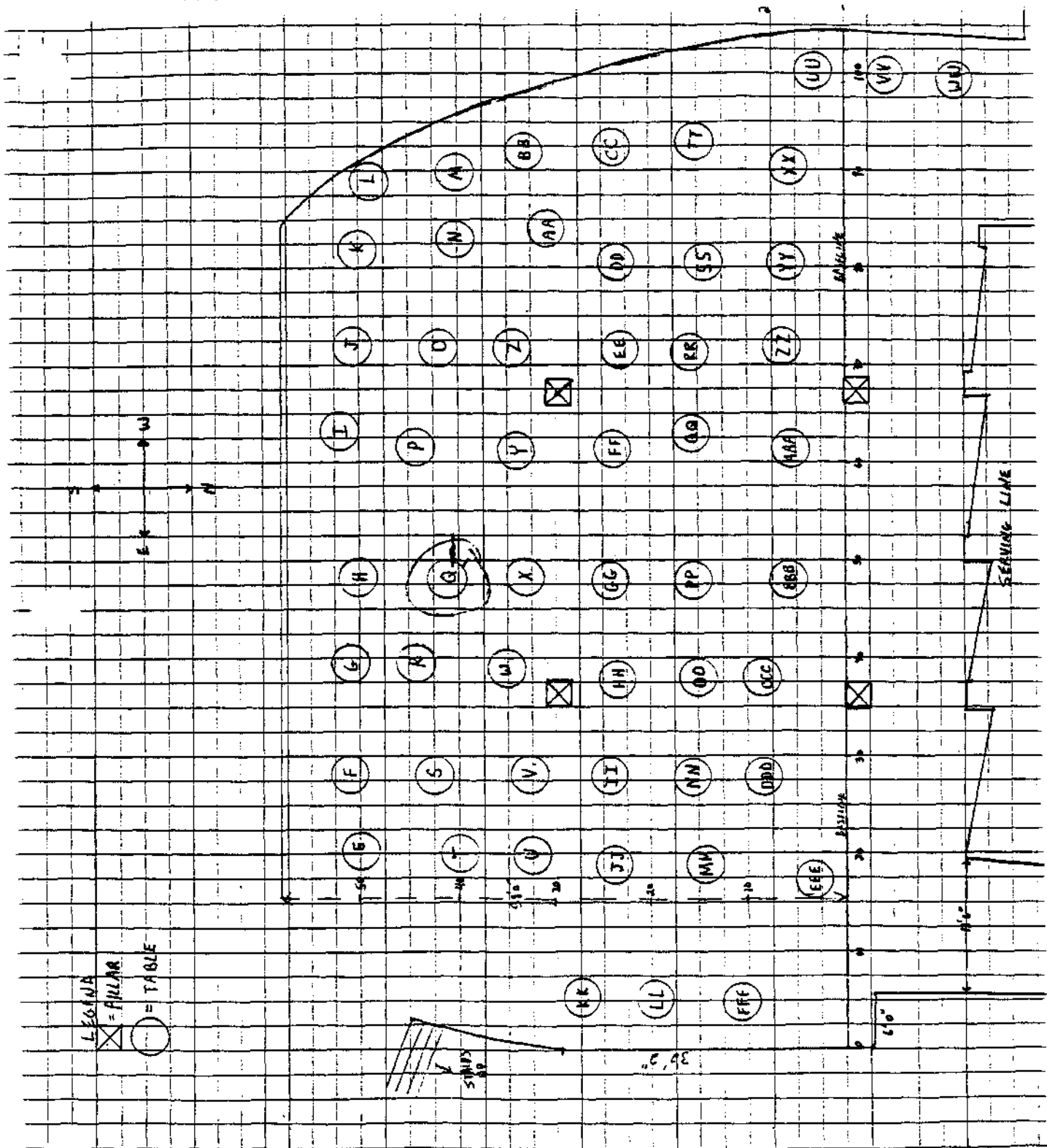

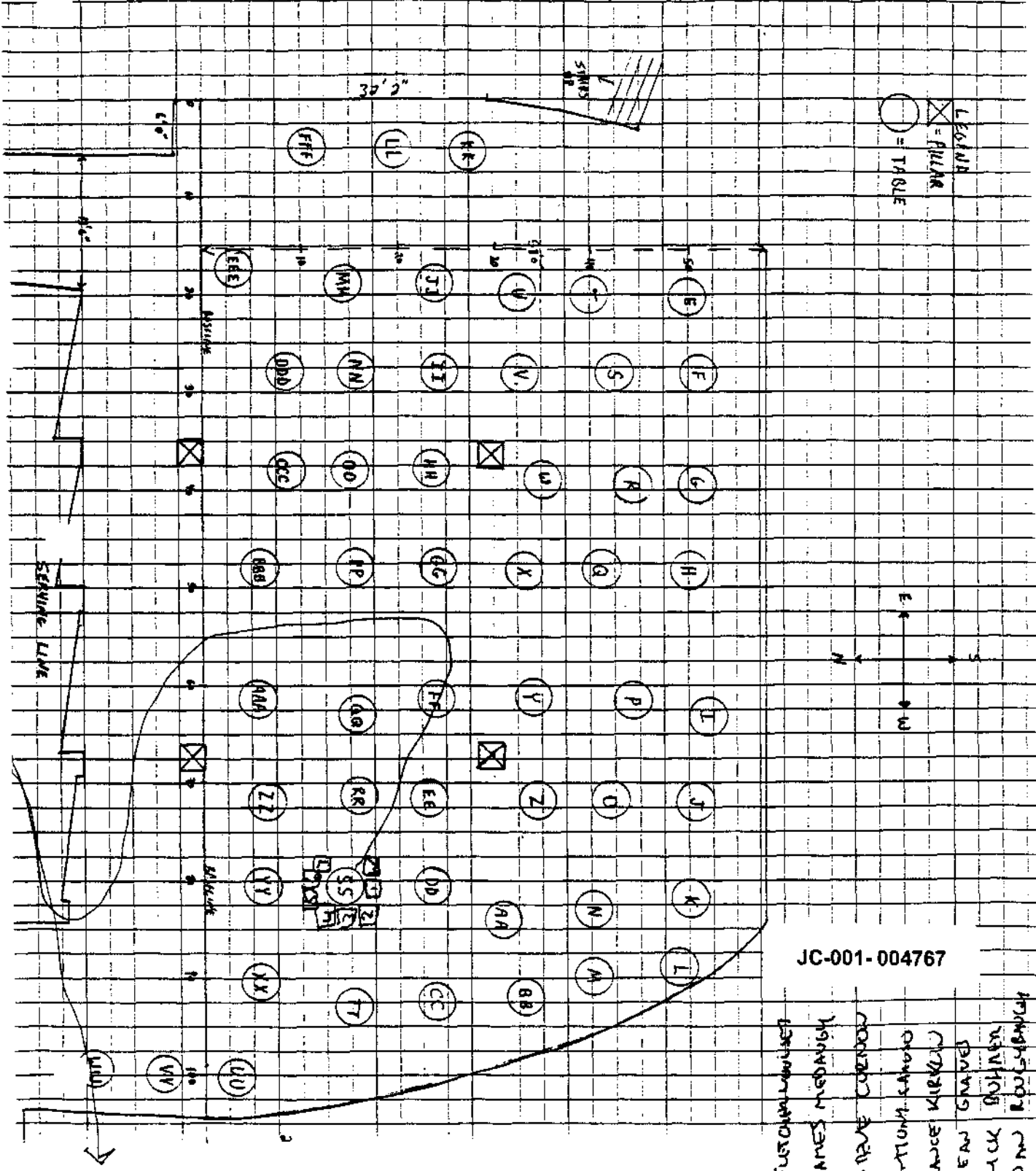
WOOLSEY stated he was sitting in the west corner of the cafeteria near the vending machines when the attack began. He heard the sounds of gunshots coming from outside. WOOLSEY looked outside and saw a white male, over six feet tall, thin build, wearing a black trench coat, a black baseball cap worn backwards, and carrying a shotgun. WOOLSEY said he saw this individual outside the commons area raise the shotgun in the direction of the school. WOOLSEY then dropped to the floor and heard the sound of the shotgun blast. The shooter then moved toward the front of the school. According to WOOLSEY, many students started running towards the stairs and WOOLSEY heard the sound of gunfire coming from the upstairs area. WOOLSEY stated he ran into the kitchen bathroom and hid with five to six other people for 30 minutes to an hour. WOOLSEY stated Dustin GORTON and Brett KOSTALNICK, two of the people hiding in the bathroom, ventured out to see if the cafeteria was clear. After GORTON and KOSTALNICK indicated it was clear to leave, WOOLSEY ran through the cafeteria and outside into the parking lot and took cover behind a car. WOOLSEY said he later ran to the soccer field and took cover inside of a police car. Police later transported him over to Caley Court where a triage and holding area was established. WOOLSEY stated he did not notice any strange backpacks or bags in the cafeteria.



WORLOCK stated she stayed on the ground for a short period of time and then looked out the window and saw KLEBOLD on the hill by the senior parking lot. KLEBOLD was wearing a black trench coat, camouflage pants, and a ski mask. She was able to recognize KLEBOLD by his hair that was still visible under the mask. WORLOCK stated she realized KLEBOLD was heading for the cafeteria so she grabbed Brandi Wiseman by the arm and headed for the office in the kitchen. According to WORLOCK, there were 18 people in the kitchen, including two kitchen workers. Someone in the kitchen called 911 and reported the incident and how many people were hiding there. SWAT team members were able to evacuate the group two hours later.

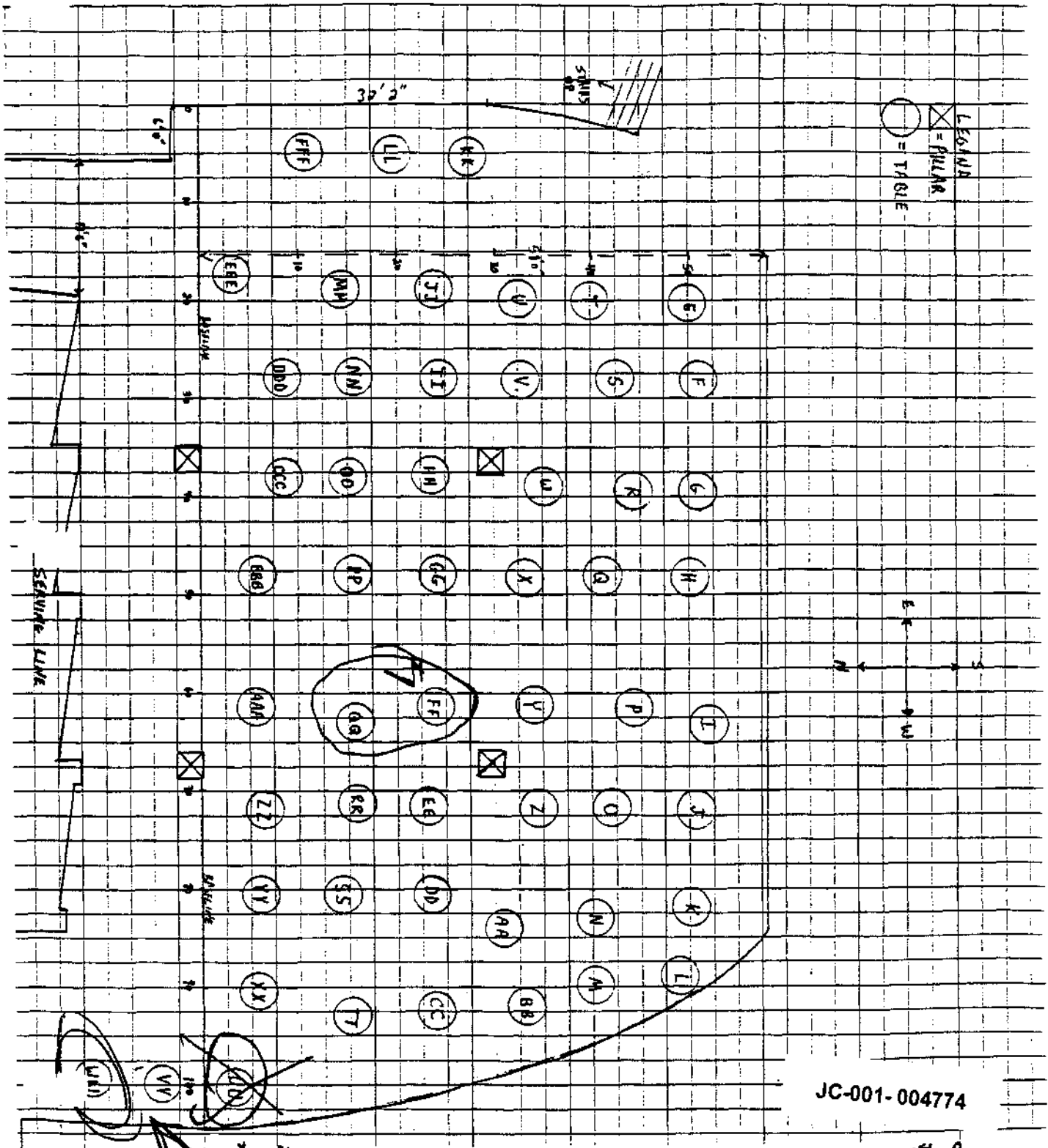

She stated that he was on his way out the door, but she would have him call me. She also stated that she has a daughter, Whitney Woydziak, who is also a Columbine High School student and she suggested that I interview her at the same time. She stated she would have both Whitney and Jonathan call me.

On 06-14-99, at about 1205 hours, I received a page with the phone number, 972-9334. At about 12:30 hours, I contacted that number and spoke with Jonathan Woydziak. I told Jonathan Woydziak that I wanted to speak to him about Columbine High School and the incident on 04-20-99. I asked him where he had been during the incident. Woydziak stated that he had just walked into the school when the incident started. Woydziak stated that his fourth hour class was a science class with Mr. Johnson. Woydziak stated that he and a friend finished a test early and left class and the school at about 1105 hours. Woydziak stated he left the science hall, went down the stairs and out through the Commons. I asked him if he noticed anything unusual in the cafeteria or Commons. He stated that it was full, as usual, and there was nothing unusual about the cafeteria. Woydziak stated he went with his friend, Andrew Conand to the Senior Parking Lot, where Conand was parked and they left in Conand's vehicle. Woydziak said he noticed nothing unusual in the parking lot either. Woydziak stated they drove to McDonald's at Pierce

and Coal Mine, went through the drive-thru and ate the hamburgers in the car coming back to the school. Woydziak stated he believes they returned to the school parking lot at about 1115 hours. He stated that they came in the side doors of the cafeteria, not through the main entrance of the Commons. He stated that as they came inside, they began hearing "popping noises." Woydziak stated that kids were saying to run into to the auditorium. He stated that he and his friend went out the same side doors they had just come in, and ran east bound on the sidewalk, across Pierce Street, to the park. He stated that he didn't see where the noises were coming from. Woydziak stated that at the park there were lots of kids and they heard noises that sounded more like gunshots. He stated from there, he went to a house.

I asked Woydziak if he knew either Dylan Klebold or Eric Harris and he stated that he did not, but that he had seen both of them previously in the school. I asked him if he knew either of their cars. He stated that he had seen Klebold's black BMW with the "Ramstein" stickers. I asked him if he had seen it on 04-20-99, and he stated that he honestly didn't know. I asked him if he had seen either Klebold or Harris on 04-20-99, and he stated he had not. I asked Woydziak if there was anything he had heard or seen prior or since the incident that he thought might help and he stated there was not.

I asked Woydziak if his sister Whitney Woydziak was home and he stated she was not and stated he would give her a message to contact me.

Heather stated she heard a shot from the West door, outside and then
a second shot. She saw a person go down outside after the shot.

At this time Heather stated Mr. Sanders yelled for everyone to get
down and they all went under the tables.

Heather stated she could see a suspect outside. She described him
as a Cauc. Male, 17 - 18 YOA, 6', lanky, blondish/brown hair over
the ears. She stated his face was dark, like he had a mask on. He
was wearing a black trench coat ankle length, open. She saw a black
shirt and black boots tall enough to reach the bottom of the trench
coat. Heather stated the weapon was in his left hand and he held it
with both hands. It was a long gun like a shotgun and he was

Heather stated she remembers seeing "stuff" on him but she can't describe it.

Heather stated the only person she knows who drives a white Ford Bronco is Chris Lucas a freshman. She doesn't think he is a TCM member.

Heather stated she didn't see or hear any bombs. She stated the sprinkler system didn't go off while she was in the cafeteria.

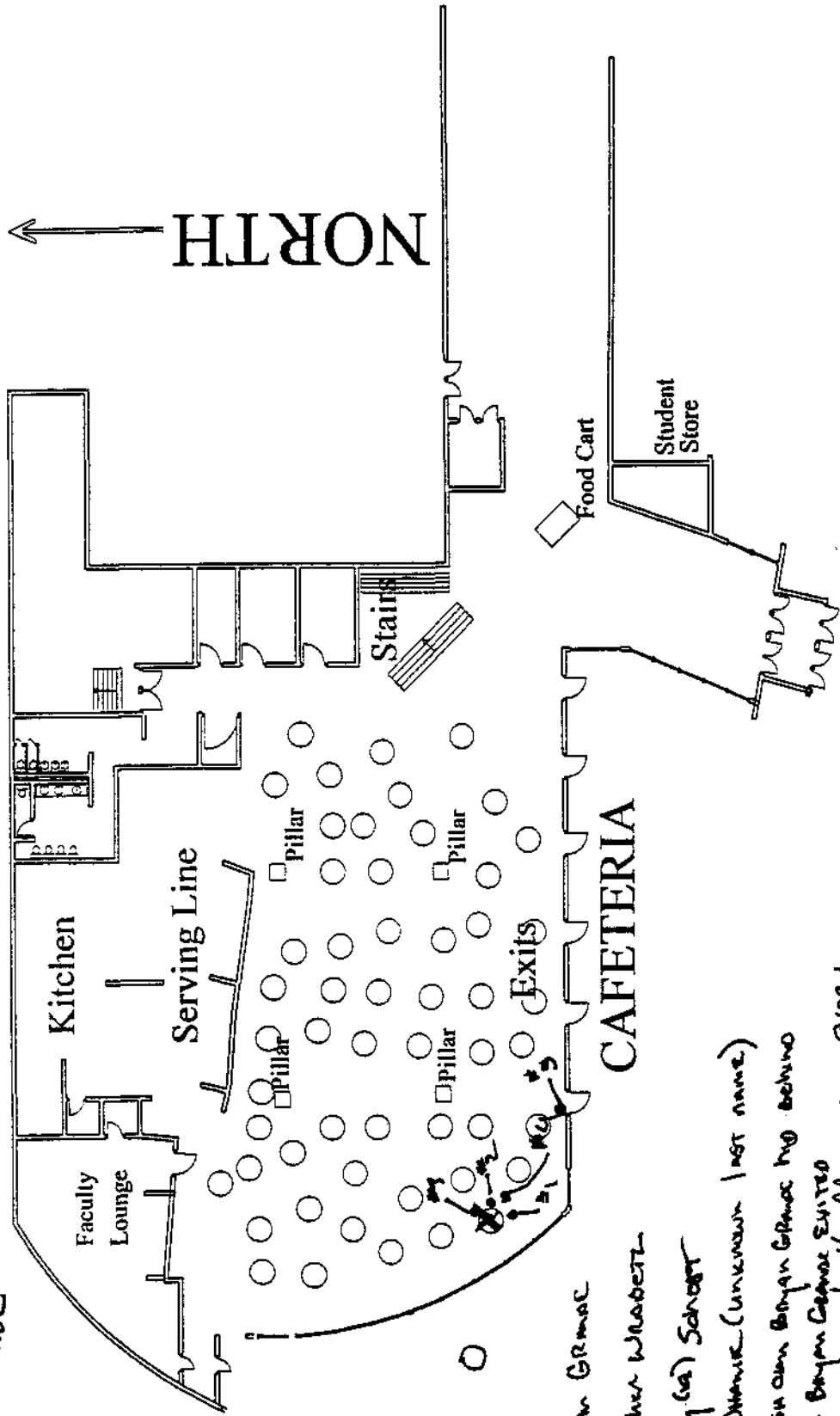

I ASKED HIM HOW LONG HE HAD OBSERVED HARRIS. (W) WRIGHT SAID FOR ABOUT ONE (1) MINUTE. HE ALSO SAID HE WAS ABOUT 40 FEET FROM HIM, THAT HARRIS WAS BY HIMSELF.



INVESTIGATION:

On 04-26-99, Special Agent Barnett and I went to 5391 South Garland Way in Littleton for the purpose of interviewing Aaron James Wright, dob/03-30-82, who resides at the above address.

On 04-26-99, at 1550 hours, an interview was conducted with witness Wright, with his parents present. The following is a summary of that interview.

Wright stated on 04-20-99, he was attending Columbine High School, and that he arrived at school at approximately 8:45 a.m. (3rd period). After leaving 3rd period, he went to his History class. Wright stated after 4th period History at 11:10 a.m., he went to his vehicle and dropped off his backpack as he always does, at space #206, in the southwest parking lot. At approximately 11:15 a.m., Wright saw Eric Harris coming along the sidewalk by the cafeteria, walking west towards the stairs. Wright stated Harris was wearing a trench coat, and he stated he identified him by knowing him by past acquaintance. Wright stated Harris was carrying what he described as a sports or athletic bag, approximately 18 to 24 inches long, and about 12 inches wide, black in color, somewhat square. Wright stated it appeared the bag was very heavy, and Harris was carrying it with two hands. Wright stated he then walked into the cafeteria leaving Harris continuing to walk on the sidewalk now northbound. Wright stated he believes he sat at table "M" when shown a diagram of the cafeteria. Wright further described Eric Harris as wearing a black trench coat, black pants, and black boots. Wright stated he was seated at the lunch table with the following students: Spencer Wright (his brother), Daniel Grangerly, Seth Dubois, Mike Huntington, Brian Fuselier, Casey Jackman, and Philip Secrest. Wright stated while looking out the window of the cafeteria towards the Senior parking lot, he observed Chad Lofland, a friend of his, standing by the car owned by Chad Lofland. With Lofland was Tim Castle, and Dan (unknown last name). Wright further explained he saw Chad Lofland leave with those individuals in Lofland's vehicle, at which time Lofland's vehicle confronted Dylan Klebold's black BMW in the parking lane, at which time Lofland had to back his vehicle up to let Klebold pass. Wright stated at approximately 11:18 a.m., he observed students standing in the corner by the vending machine all drop down in a crouching position. Wright stated at about this time, he and others at his table got under the table and they heard yelling and screaming by students. Wright stated everybody started using the stairs to exit the cafeteria. Wright stated he crawled to the rebel corner and ran down the hall towards the Spanish rooms, which is the southeast rooms lower level. Wright stated once inside the Spanish room, he attempted to dial 9-1-1 and got a busy signal. Wright stated while in the Spanish room, he was told by Mrs.

Lucas, a teacher at the school, to run out of the building, to which they did, to the area of Polk and Pierce, and made contact at a seminary, at which time they contacted their parents. Wright stated he believed his brother called home at approximately 11:33 a.m..

Wright stated he recalled an incident approximately a month ago; wherein Seniors at the Columbine High School were walking behind Eric Harris, at which time these Seniors (names unknown) made statements towards Harris, such as, "The war is over, you can go home." Wright said he overheard Eric Harris respond, "Shut up assholes."

Wright stated on Thursday, 04-22-99, he talked with Megan Minger, a student at Columbine High School, who told him she had seen Eric Harris outside the school by the west entrance prior to the incident.

Wright stated he believes the total time he was in the school was approximately six to eight minutes.

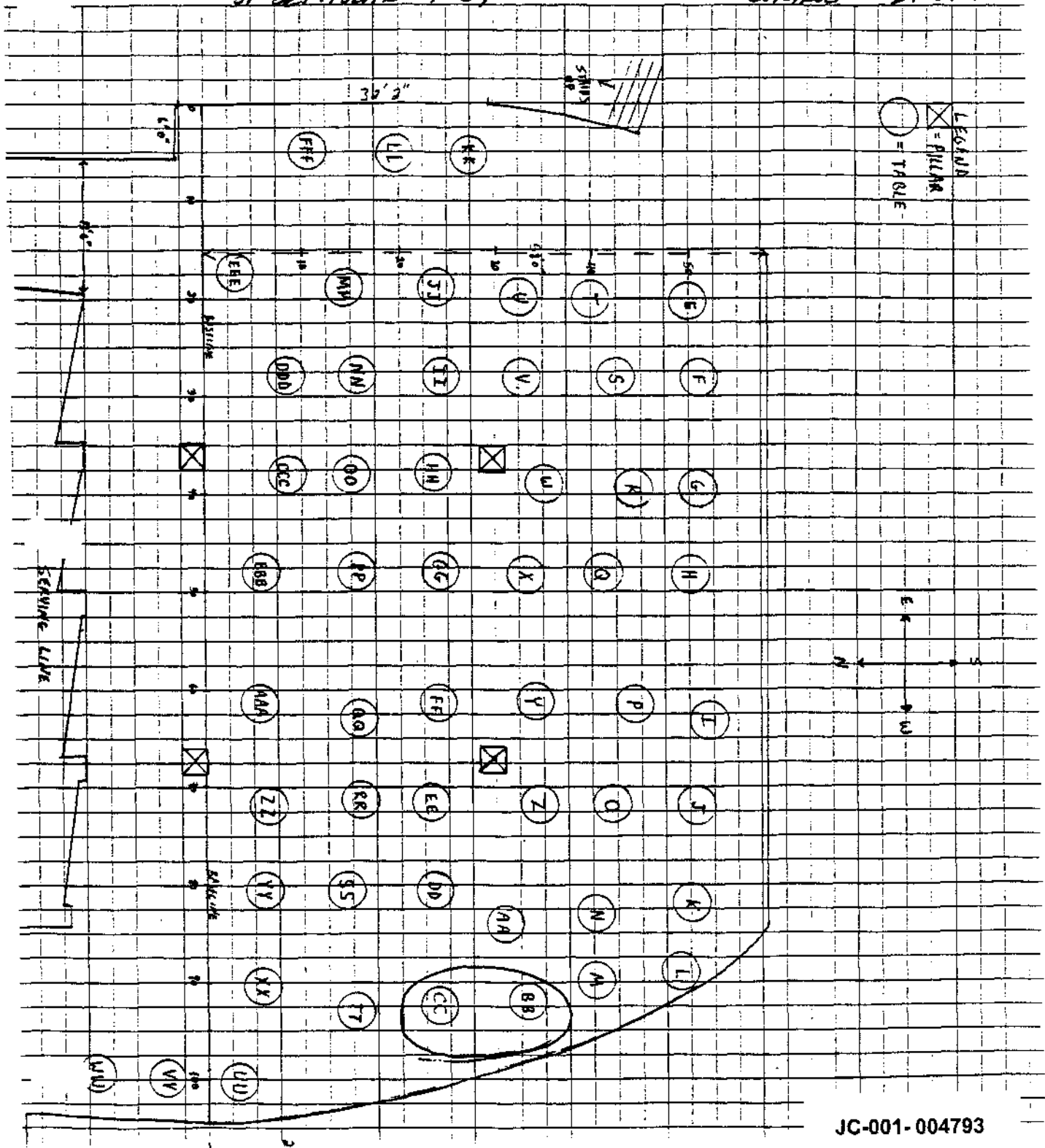

INVESTIGATION:

On 5/11/99, I met with Stephanie Wujcikowski at her residence reference the shooting at Columbine High School. I asked Stephanie if she was in the cafeteria on the day of the shooting and she said yes, she was. At this time I brought out a diagram of the cafeteria and asked her to circle the table where she was sitting. She said the table where she was sitting was not on the diagram and showed me the area in which she was sitting. I drew 4 tables on the map towards the stairs. Stephanie said she was sitting at one table, she could not remember which one, and circled two of the tables. Stephanie said she was not actually sitting at the table, but her backpack was there. Stephanie said she was standing by the table and marked on the map where she was standing. I asked Stephanie if she could tell me what happened that day. She said she was in the cafeteria and observed everyone stand up and then heard a girl say "they have a gun". Stephanie said that once she heard that she ran outside the cafeteria and looked back into the cafeteria once she was outside. Stephanie said she did not see anything in the cafeteria, but she heard two shots and one explosion. I asked where the shots were coming from, inside or out, and she said she did not know for sure. Stephanie said that she stayed next to the building and ran towards Leewood Park. I asked Stephanie if she heard any shots being fired while she was running and she said, yes, she did. Stephanie said that she also heard that the suspects were shooting into Leewood Park. I asked where she heard this from and she said just from other students that were in the Park. Stephanie told me that she had spoken to numerous students that said that the shooters came in by the stairway door. She said that is not correct, as she was standing there and no one came in by her. She believes that they came in on the west end of the cafeteria. I asked Stephanie if she had seen who was doing the shooting and she said no, she did not. I asked if she remembered seeing two large duffel bags in the cafeteria and she said, no. I asked if she remembered seeing anyone carrying or in possession of two duffel bags and she said, no. I asked if she remembered seeing Dylan or Eric on Monday or Tuesday and she again said, "no". I asked if she left anything behind in the cafeteria and she said she left her purple Eddie Bauer backpack with her school books and contents. I asked if she had seen or talked to any of the Trench Coat Mafia members on Monday or Tuesday and she said "no". I asked if she heard anything from anyone reference the suspects, bomb making or buying of guns. Stephanie said the only thing she has heard was from a girl in the Park whom she did not know, who said she saw four people in the school shooting. I asked if she had any idea who this girl was and she said, no. Stephanie said she also heard from another student (one she did not know) that they had heard one of the shooters say, "we're not finished yet". I asked Stephanie if she could remember who said that, and she said no, she could not.

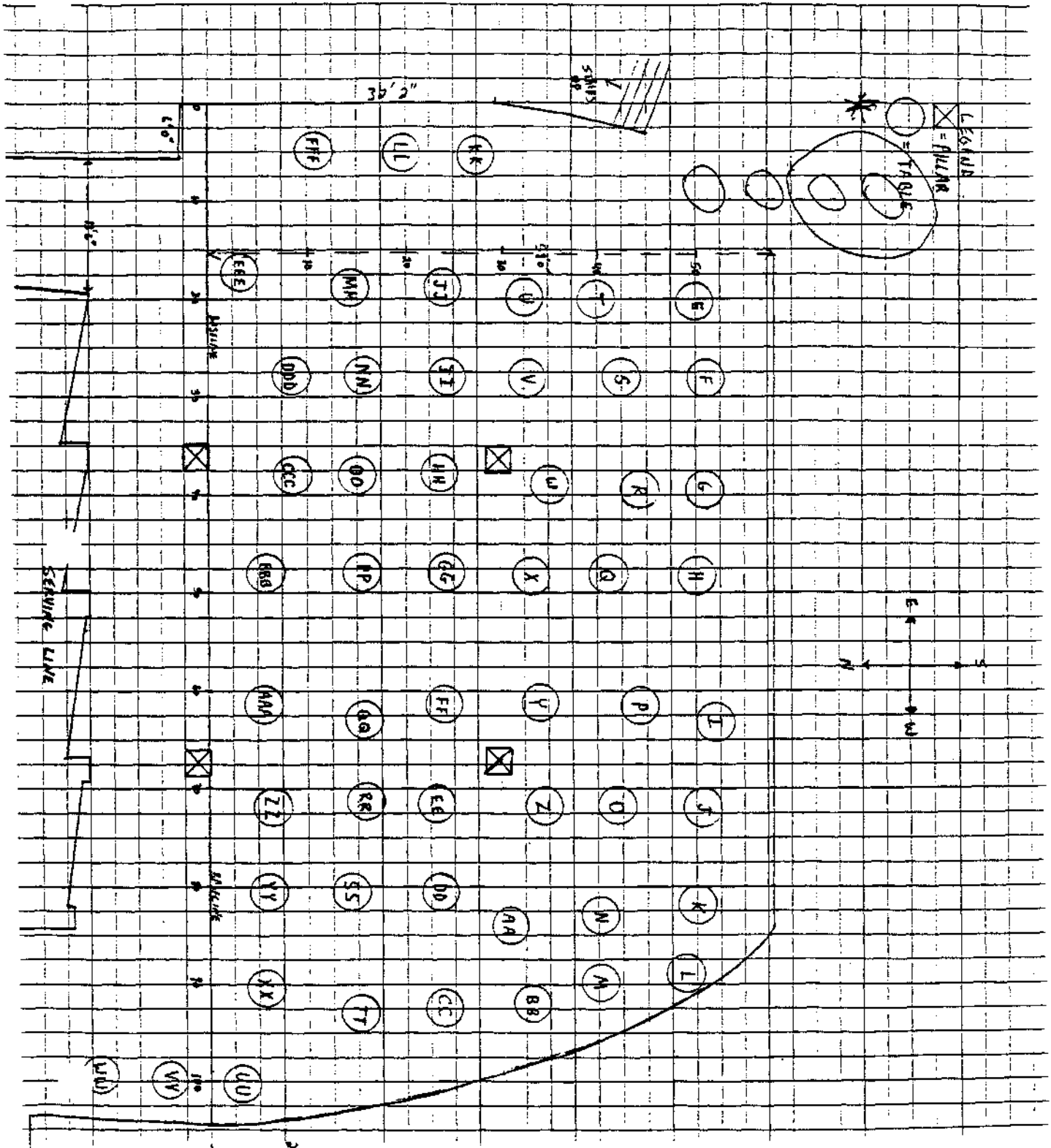

I asked Stephanie what time she entered the cafeteria and she said approximately 11:15. I asked her what class she was coming from and she said "Math". I asked Stephanie if she uses the Internet and she said she does at her father's house. I asked if she has a screen name and she says that she uses "F space BAILEE space 7". I asked her if she knows anyone with a double pierced eyebrow and she said "no". I asked her if she remembers hearing any unusual announcements prior to the shooting and she said that she has been told by other students that there was an announcement reference "Today's going to be a bad day", but she didn't hear it. I asked if she could provide any further information on the Trench Coat Mafia and she said "no". I asked Stephanie if there was any other information she could provide that would assist with this investigation and she said not that she can remember. I gave Stephanie one of my business cards and asked that she call me with any further information. At this time the interview with Stephanie was concluded.



WYANT stated she was in the cafeteria near the vending machines when she heard gunshots coming from outside. A teacher told everyone to get down on the floor. WYANT stated she got on the floor and stayed there until a kitchen employee told her and several other students to come into her office and hide. Someone in the office called 911 and reported the incident to the police. According to WYANT, there were approximately 18 people hiding in the office. She stated a SWAT team arrived after approximately two hours and escorted them out of the building. WYANT eventually was transported to Caley CT. where she was released.

WYANT stated she was seated at a table near the vending machines during lunch. According to WYANT the people sitting at her table were:

Brandi WISEMAN
Brittany DAVIES
Jamie MUNKEBY
Tiffany SPIVAK
Jean (last name unknown, boyfriend of SPIVAK)
Tasha NYGARD

WYANT stated she did not notice any other backpacks or bags other than the ones that were with her group of friends. WYANT said she did not see anyone shooting weapons or throwing bombs. WYANT stated she only heard the gunfire and explosions.

INVESTIGATION:

On 5/12/99, I met with Lindsey Wyant at her residence reference the Columbine shooting. I asked Lindsey if she was in the cafeteria during the shooting and she said, yes, she was. I brought out a sketch of the cafeteria and asked that she circle where she was in the cafeteria. Lindsey circled table "AAA" and placed an "x" where she was sitting. I asked Lindsey if she could explain to me what had happened that day. Lindsey said she went to a vending machine with Brandy Wiseman, and there was nothing in the machine that she wanted. This was the machine located by the stairway, so she then went to the vending machine located by the food line and while there, she heard a male say "get off of me" and then the male said "I'm shot, I can't feel anything". Lindsey said that she looked outside and saw a male laying on the ground. Lindsey said before she heard the comments, she heard gunshots from outside, but did not know where they came from. Lindsey said after this she heard a teacher telling everyone to get out of the cafeteria. Lindsey said she ran into the kitchen area and then into the cook's office. Lindsey said that she was in the cook's office with numerous other students and they closed and barricaded the door so no one could get in. Lindsey said there were numerous people knocking on the door trying to get in, but they did not let anyone in, as they did not know if they were the shooters or just other students trying to get into the office. Lindsey said she was in the office for approximately two and a half to three hours until the SWAT team got them out. I asked Lindsey if she heard any shooting of any explosions while in the office and she said she heard shots being fired from above (the library area) and also heard shots coming from the cafeteria area. Lindsey said that when the SWAT team got them out of the office, they ran through the cafeteria to a window. They then crawled out the window and ran next to the wall of the school to a fire truck, where they were taken out of the area. I asked Lindsey if she ever saw who was doing the shooting and she said, no, she did not. I asked Lindsey if she saw two large duffel bags in the cafeteria and she said, no. I asked if she knew who Eric and Dylan were and she said, no, she did not. She said she had seen them around school, but did not know them. I asked if she had seen them on Monday or Tuesday and she said, no, she had not. I asked Lindsey if she left anything in the cafeteria when she ran out of there. She said she left a backpack which contained books by the table where she was sitting. I asked if she had seen or talked to any of the Trench Coat Mafia on Monday or Tuesday and she said "no". I asked if she heard anything from anyone regarding other suspects, bombs being made, or buying of guns. She said she heard a rumor that [redacted] was a part of this and had left before the shooting. I asked who told her this and she said it was just a rumor that she had heard. I asked if she remembers what she was wearing that day and she said she had on a blue shirt and khaki shorts. I asked what time she entered the cafeteria and she said approximately 11:15 a.m.
